This instruction implements Air Force Policy Directive (AFPD) 41-2, *Medical Support*, and is used in conjunction with Technical Order (TO) 00-35A-39, *First Aid Kits*. This instruction establishes responsibilities and procedures for storage and refurbishment of Individual First Aid Kits (IFAK) and Aircraft First Aid Kits (AFAK) for the 911th Airlift Wing (AW). It applies to all personnel in the 911 AW. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with Air Force Manual (AFMAN) 33-363, Management of Records, and disposed of in accordance with Air Force Records Information Management System (AFRIMS) Records Disposition Schedule (RDS) located at https://www.my.af.mil/afirms/afirms/afirms/rds/rds_series.cfm.” Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility (OPR) using Air Force (AF) Form 847, Recommendation for Change of Publication; route AF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional’s chain of command. SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This instruction has been substantially revised and must be completely rewritten. Major changes include the removal of the paragraph 4 along with sub-paragraphs and updates to the mobility section that includes information about the Material Inventory Accounting System (MICAS).

1. General. The 911th Aeromedical Staging Squadron (ASTS) is the host medical material supplier for all units of the 911 AW.

2. Responsibilities. All units assigned Individual First Aid Kits (IFAKs) have the responsibility to identify and fund first aid kit requirements. The 911 ASTS refurbishes used or outdated IFAKs based on these requirements and according to T.O.00-35A-39.

3. Guidelines:

3.1. **Mobility "A" Bags/IFAKs.** The 911th Logistics Readiness Squadron (LRS) maintains all base military members Mobility "A" bags. IFAKs are inventoried as part of these mobility bags. The 911 LRS is responsible for maintaining the stored kits IAW Material Inventory Accounting System (MICAS) and bringing them to ASTS during the Unit Training Assembly (UTA) prior to the expiration date for updating. The ASTS will provide updated kits within two UTAs from the time the kits are turned in regardless of expiration status.

3.2. **"Hard" AFAKs:** The 758th Airlift Squadron (AS) is the only unit authorized individual AFAKs at the 911 AW. These AFAKs are part of each assigned C-130H aircraft inventory. The 911 AMXS is responsible for maintaining these kits. AMXS will store the spares and distribute AFAKs to the aircraft and take responsibility to keep them current on the inspections. Upon request from the AMXS, the 911 ASTS will provide updated kits within one UTA from the time the kits are turned in regardless of expiration status.

3.3. **Life Raft and Survival Vest Kits:** The 758 AS is the only unit authorized these specific kits at the 911 AW. The Aircrew Flight Equipment section (911 OSS/OSL) will maintain the kits at their facility, and are responsible for maintaining these kits. The 911 OSF/OSL will work with the 911 LRS for refurbishment of first aid kit supplies.

3.4. **The 911 ASTS:** The ASTS is not staffed full time with the appropriate Air Force specialty code (AFSC) to support refurbishment activities during normal business hours. IFAKs will be updated during regular UTA times.
