THE AIR FORCE INSPECTION SYSTEM

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This supplement complements AFI 90-201, *The Air Force Inspection System*. This publication applies to active duty and ACC-gained Air Reserve Component wings. Send comments and suggested improvements on AF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*, through channels, to ACC/IGI, 205 Thornell Avenue, Bldg. 621, JB Langley-Eustis VA 23665-2799. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with (IAW) AFMAN 33-363, *Management of Records*, and disposed of IAW Air Force Records Information Management System (AFRIMS) Records Disposition Schedule (RDS). Contact supporting records managers as required. Units may supplement this document as needed. The authorities to waive wing/unit level requirements in this publication are identified with a Tier (“T-0, T-1, T-2, T-3”) number following the compliance statement. See AFI 33-360, *Publications and Forms Management*, for a description of the authorities associated with the Tier numbers. Submit requests for waivers through the chain of command to the appropriate Tier waiver approval authority, or alternately, to the Publication OPR for non-tiered compliance items.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This document is completely revised to support the latest Air Force Inspection System (AFIS) guidance. It must be completely reviewed. Major changes include: Requirement for ACC staff to further develop ACC-specific business rules for ACC staff continual evaluation roles/responsibilities; addition of guidance for Cryptologic Operations oversight; document authority for 25 AF/CC to create Numbered Air Force Interest Items specific to cryptologic oversight role; identification of below ACC units that will receive Management Inspections; and requirement for wings to exercise/evaluate wartime requirements through Operational Readiness Exercises.

(ACC) This interim change revises AFI 90-201_ACCSUP to align with AFI 90-201 Table 5.2 Air Force Installation Mission Assurance Exercise Requirements, (ADDED) Readiness Assessment annual frequency requirement.

1.5.11.1.1. (Added) ACC will establish and execute continual evaluation roles, responsibilities and battle rhythm IAW AFI 90-201 and ACC staff business rules (OPR: ACC/IG; OCR: All ACC Staff Directorates and Special Staff) approved and signed by ACC/CV. **(T-2)**.

2.4.2.1.2.1. **(Added)** Cryptologic Operations. Air Force units conducting cryptologic operations are subject to management oversight by the Commander, Twenty-Fifth Air Force as the Air Force's Service Cryptologic Component (SCC) Commander (AFI 14-128). To maximize efficiency, the Air Force SCC Commander should leverage AFIS and National Security Agency (NSA) led Joint Inspections to the maximum extent possible to validate and verify unit effectiveness and compliance with cryptologic policy. Both AFIS and NSA Joint inspections will include IG-trained Air Force SCC personnel with access to all relevant missions. NSA Joint inspections will include an AFIS inspection of the Air Force units co-located with the NSA site.

2.9.1.1. ACC/IG (acc.ig.gate@us.af.mil), DSN: 312-574-8891, executes Gatekeeper responsibilities for ACC.

2.16.8. Commander, Air Combat Command (COMACC) has delegated the authority to create Numbered Air Force (NAF) Interest Items (NII) for UEIs to the 25th AF Commander due to his/her role as the Air Force SCC Commander. 25 AF/IG (ACC/IG Team E) will notify all subordinate units/organizations (including gained ARC units) of NII requirements as soon as possible following publication of a NII.

3.1.1.1. **(Added)** ACC/IG will accomplish Management Inspections (MI) on the following units: 1 AF, 9 AF, 12 AF, 25 AF, USAFWC, and AFCENT. ACC/IG is the approval authority for the ACC MI schedule which is maintained on the ACC Gatekeeper.

4.1.1. **(Added)** ACC/IG maintains *ACC/IG Business Practices*, which help wings better understand the UEI process and to bridge the gaps between policy and execution. The *Business Practices* complement AFI 90-201 and the SAF/IG CCIP Guide. The Business Practices are available on the ACC/IG Portal webpage: <https://www.my.af.mil/gcss-af/USAF/site/ACC/IG>.

5.1.3. **(Added)** AFCENT/CC, in coordination with ACC/IG and as approved by COMACC, will determine applicability and scope of CCIP at Air Expeditionary Wings (AEW). ACC/IG will provide assessment support to AEWs in coordination with AFCENT/CC.

5.9.2.5.3.1.1. **(Added)** Phase 1/2 Operational Readiness Exercises (ORE) remain one of the most effective mission preparation tools for wings to assess wartime readiness, identify resource-to-requirement gaps and accurately report readiness to meet mission directives and Designed Operation Capability (DOC) requirements in support of Operational Plans (OPLANS). At least once per UEI cycle, all applicable wing units shall exercise and execute mission directive/DOC taskings as expected in applicable wartime plans. Relevant planning guidance (e.g. War Mobilization Plan [WMP]-5 rates) will be used for determining exercise objectives and measures of success. **(T-2)**. Scope, scenario and duration of OREs are at WG/CC discretion and can be proportionally scaled to available Unit Type Code (UTC) resources. Rationale for proportionality and wing-determined simulations/deviations will be documented in the wing's inspection report. **(T-2)**.

5.9.2.5.3.1.1. (**Added-ACC**) Readiness Assessments (Table 5.2.) Phase 1/2 Operational Readiness Exercises (ORE) remain one of the most effective mission preparation tools for wings to assess wartime readiness, identify resource-to-requirement gaps and accurately report readiness to meet mission directives and Designed Operation Capability (DOC) requirements in support of Operational Plans (OPLANS). Relevant planning guidance (e.g. War Mobilization Plan [WMP]-5 rates) should be used for determining exercise objectives and measures of success. Scope, scenario and duration of readiness assessment exercises are at WG/CC discretion and can be proportionally scaled to available Unit Type Code (UTC) resources. Rationale for proportionality and wing-determined simulations/deviations will be documented in the wing's inspection report (**T-2**).

7.5.3. Joint Base (JB) Wing/IGs will maintain all applicable JB directives, guidance and agreements and provide them to the ACC/IG Team Chief. ACC/IG Team Chiefs will coordinate with inspected unit wing commander prior to inspection events to ensure common understanding of the applicable standards that ACC/IG inspectors will apply.
