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This supplement implements and extends the guidance of AFI 11-2HH-60, Volume 1, *HH-60G Aircrew Training*. This supplement applies to all AETC, Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC), and Air National Guard (ANG) HH-60 units and personnel under the oversight of AETC. Units may supplement this instruction and will coordinate supplements with AETC/A3V before approval, then forward a copy to AETC/A3V after publication. Submit suggested improvements to this publication on AF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*, through standardization and evaluation (Stan/Eval) channels, to AETC/A3V. See Attachment 1 for a glossary of references and supporting information. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with (IAW) Air Force Manual (AFMAN) 33-363, *Management of Records*, and disposed of IAW Air Force Records Information Management System (AFRIMS). The authorities to waive wing/unit level requirements in this publication are identified with a Tier ("T-0, T-1, T-2, T-3") number following the compliance statement. See AFI 33-360, *Publications and Forms Management*, for a description of the authorities associated with the Tier numbers. Submit requests for waivers through the chain of command to the appropriate Tier waiver approval authority, or alternately, to the Publication OPR for non-tiered compliance items publications.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This document has been substantially revised and must be completely reviewed. Major changes include AETC/A2/3/10 approval of OG/CC extending currencies (1.18.1.3), changed BMC regression triggers (4.7), clarified RAP look back requirements (4.8) and authorized use of ACC SOIs for secondary method training (5.1.1).

1.4.2. Training Command. Formal school course and syllabus management procedures are prescribed in AETCI 36-2221, *Flying Training Course and Special Publications Development*, AETCI 36-2205, Volume 1, *Formal Flying Training Administration and Management*, and AETCI 36-2205, Volume 8, *Formal Flying Training Administration and Management - Special Operations/Personnel Recovery*. 1.12.1. Approval for waivers, deviations and omitted training items will be IAW AETCI 36-2205 V8 for formal courses and IAW the applicable SOI for MAJCOM approved certifications.

1.18. Waiver Authority. Unless otherwise specified, AETC/A2/3/10 is waiver authority for this publication and supplement. Universal waivers that would change the intent of the policy outlined in this publication are not authorized without AETC/A2/3/10 approval. AETC units and other MAJCOMs will coordinate waivers through command channels, as outlined in this publication. Waivers to this publication will be filed IAW AFI 33-360, Publications and Forms Management. The operations group commander (OG/CC) is the waiver authority for unit level supplements to this publication. (T-2)

1.18.1.3. **(Added)** AETC A2/3/10 approves OG/CC's to extend the currency requirements outlined in paragraphs 1.18.1.1 & 1.18.1.2.

3.2. Local Mission Qualification Training. Units will utilize a locally produced and 58th OG/CC approved Local Mission Qualification Training (LMQT) SOI. (T-2)

4.7. N-BMC/N-CMR Regression. AETC aircrew will adhere to the provisions in paragraph 4.7 except where supplemented (T-3).

4.7.3. Overdue currency items (ground or flight) will not automatically result in aircrew regression to N-BMC. Sq/CC will determine whether delinquent items affect unit mission and warrant regression. (T-3)

4.7.4. 1-Mo / 3-Mo RAP lookback is only required if crewmembers are deploying to augment an operational unit. Crewmembers must meet the CMR 1-month lookback requirements for RAP sorties/events prior to deploying unless the requesting organization specifically directs otherwise. (T-3)

4.8. End-of-Cycle Requirements. Aircrew failing to meet end-of-cycle RAP event or sortie requirements will remain BMC at the discretion of the Sq/CC. Should the Sq/CC deem the shortfalls significant enough to warrant regression to N-BMC, aircrew will complete a Sq/CC approved re-certification program. (T-2)

5.1.1. Where an AETC SOI does not exist, AETC units are authorized to use ACC approved SOIs posted on the ACC/A3JT Website.

5.4.2. The 58 OG/CC will determine the minimum flight hours required for upgrade of permanent party exchange officers.
