Mission Directive

MAINTENANCE GROUPS

COMPLIANCE WITH THIS PUBLICATION IS MANDATORY

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This publication implements Air Force Policy Directive (AFPD) 10-1, *Mission Directives*. It delineates the mission, command relationships, and responsibilities of the Air Force Reserve Maintenance Groups (MXG). It does not apply to Regular Air Force (RegAF) or Air National Guard (ANG) units. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained IAW AFMAN 33-363, *Management of Records*, and disposed of IAW the Air Force Records Information Management System (AFRIMS) Records Disposition Schedule (RDS). Contact supporting records managers as required. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility (OPR) using Air Force Form 847, Recommendation for Change of Publication; route AF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command. This publication may be supplemented at any level, but all direct supplements must be routed to the OPR of this publication prior to certification and approval. The authorities to waive wing/unit level requirements in this publication are identified with a Tier (“T-0, T-1, T-2, T-3”) number following the compliance statement. See AFI 33-360, *Publications and Forms Management*, for a description of the authorities associated with the Tier numbers. Submit requests for waivers through the chain of command to the appropriate Tier waiver approval authority, or alternately, to the Publication OPR for non-tiered compliance items.

This is a new Mission Directive and must be reviewed in its entirety.

1. Mission: Responsible to launch, recover, service, inspect, troubleshoot, and repair aircraft. Provide rapid and flexible force options that allow military forces to respond to and operate in a wider variety of circumstances and time frames to include humanitarian relief operations.

1.1. In AFRC non-standard/associated units, MXG elements may be included in the Maintenance Squadron. Refer to AFRCMD1108, *Maintenance Squadron*, for mission responsibilities for elements when assigned within the MXS.

2. Command. The Maintenance Group Commander (CC) (or equivalent) will:

2.1. Report to the Wing Commander (or equivalent).

2.2. Exercise administrative control (ADCON) over Maintenance Operations, Quality Assurance, Aircraft Maintenance Squadron (AMXS) and Maintenance Squadron (MXS) personnel and programs, when assigned.

3. Responsibilities.

3.1. Execute commanders responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commanders Responsibilities*, and Maintenance Group Commander responsibilities as outlined in AFI 21-101, *Aircraft and Equipment Maintenance Management*.

3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the maintenance mission.

4. Mobilization. AFRC forces are under the administrative control (ADCON) of AFRC/CC. When activated or mobilized (e.g. under 10 U.S.C. §§ 12301(a), 12302, 12304, 12304a, or 12304b), combatant command authority (COCOM) transfers to the combatant commander to which the forces are assigned/attached and operational control (OPCON) transfers to the operational chain of command established by that commander.
