This publication implements Air Force Policy Directive (AFPD) 10-1, *Mission Directives*. It delineates the mission, command relationships, and responsibilities of the Air Force Reserve Logistics Readiness Squadrons (LRS). It does not apply to Regular Air Force (RegAF) or Air National Guard (ANG) units. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained IAW AFMAN 33-363, *Management of Records*, and disposed of IAW the Air Force Records Information Management System (AFRIMS) Records Disposition Schedule (RDS). Contact supporting records managers as required. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility (OPR) using AF Form 847, Recommendation for Change of Publication; route AF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command. This publication may be supplemented at any level, but all direct Supplements must be routed to the OPR of this publication prior to certification and approval. Tier waiver authority for this mission directive is Tier 1 throughout. Submit requests for waivers through the chain of command to the appropriate Tier waiver approval authority, or alternately, to the publication OPR for non-tiered compliance items.

1. Mission: The primary mission the LRS/F is to provide trained Citizen Airmen to defend the United States, and logistics command and control for the wing's mission with deliberate planning and execution supporting AEF and contingency operations. The LRS will provide supply services such as aircraft refueling, bulk storage of petroleum and cryogenic products, shipping and receiving, and storage of war consumable distribution assets; provides transportation support, maintenance services, and oversight of contractor support services when and where applicable.

2. Command. The LRS/F Commander (CC):

2.1. Reports to their assigned AFRC Mission Support Group (MSG) or Regional Support Group (RSG) Commander.

2.2. Exercises administrative control (ADCON) over assigned forces.

3. Responsibilities. The LRS/F CC will:

3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commanders Responsibilities*, and Squadron Commander responsibilities as outlined in applicable AFIs.

3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the LRS/F mission.

4. Mobilization. AFRC forces are under the ADCON of AFRC/CC. When activated or mobilized (e.g. under 10 U.S.C. §§ 12301(a), 12302, 12304, 12304a, or 12304b), combatant command authority (COCOM) transfers to the combatant commander to which the forces are assigned/attached and operational control (OPCON) transfers to the operational chain of command established by that commander.
