This mission directive prescribes the mission and establishes the responsibilities for Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) aeromedical staging squadrons/flights (ASTS/ASTF). Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility (OPR) using the AF IMT 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route AF Form 847s from the field through the appropriate functional's chain of command. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with Air Force Manual (AFMAN) 33-363, *Management of Records*, and disposed of in accordance with Air Force Records Information Management System (AFRIMS) Records Disposition Schedule (RDS) located at <https://www.my.af.mil/afirms/afirms/afirms/rims.cfm>

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This publication is significantly revised and must be completely reviewed.

1. Mission: The mission of ASTS/ASTF is to train to provide a level of contingency capability sufficient to ensure appropriate supportive and emergency care for patients transiting the Enroute Care system, including aeromedical evacuation. Additionally, select ASTS/ASTF unit, through their aerospace medicine capability, provide pre- and post-mobilization medical support to authorized personnel in support of the parent wing's mission until directed otherwise by competent authority.

2. Command. The structure maintains effective operations with the least expenditures of resources and minimizes organizational turbulence when mobilized.

3. Responsibility. Established command channels apply. Communicate directly with the MEFPAK and pilot unit on matters relating to training, inspection, and safety.

4. Organizational Changes. Submit changes to the organizational structure to HQ AFRC/A1M, according to AFI 38-101, *Air Force Organization*.
