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This publication implements Air Force Policy Directive (AFPD) 10-1, Mission Directives. It delineates the mission, command relationships, and responsibilities of the Air Force Reserve Command Management Engineering Team (AFRC MET). It does not apply to Regular Air Force (RegAF) or Air National Guard (ANG) units. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained IAW AFMAN 33-363, Management of Records, and disposed of IAW the Air Force Records Information Management System (AFRIMS) Records Disposition Schedule (RDS). Contact supporting records managers as required. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility (OPR) using Air Force Form 847, Recommendation for Change of Publication; route AF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command. This publication may be supplemented at any level, but all direct Supplements must be routed to the OPR of this publication prior to certification and approval. The authorities to waive wing/unit level requirements in this publication are identified with a Tier ("T-0, T-1, T-2, T-3") number following the compliance statement. See AFI 33-360, *Publications and Forms Management*, for a description of the authorities associated with the Tier numbers. Submit requests for waivers through the chain of command to the appropriate Tier waiver approval authority, or alternately, to the Publication OPR for non-tiered compliance items.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This document is substantially revised and must be completely reviewed. Major revisions include name change and a more defined mission and command channels.

1. Mission. The mission of the AFRC MET is to determine and validate AFRC manpower requirements and provide consultant services to determine most efficient and effective organizational structures. Develop and maintain AFRC Manpower Standards. Oversee AFRC Competitive Sourcing and Privatization Program.

2. Command. The AFRC MET Chief:

- 2.1. Reports to AFRC/A1 Director as a Field Operating Agency (FOA).
- 2.2. Exercises administrative control over assigned personnel.

3. Responsibilities:

- 3.1. Provides and ensures the training and readiness of assigned personnel.
- 3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the AFRC MET mission.
