**DRESS AND PERSONAL APPEARANCE OF
AIR FORCE PERSONNEL**

COMPLIANCE WITH THIS PUBLICATION IS MANDATORY

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(Added) This supplement regulates the wear of uniforms, insignias, awards, and decorations. It illustrates the acceptable standard of personal appearance of Air Force members in uniform and standards of civilian dress and appearance. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with Air Force Manual (AFMAN) 33-363, *Management of Records*, and disposed of in accordance with Air Force Records Information Management System (AFRIMS) Records Disposition Schedule (RDS) located at <https://www.my.af.mil/afrims/afrims/afrims/rims.cfm>. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility (OPR) using Air Force (AF) Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route AF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional' s chain of command.

(Added) This document has been substantially revised and must be completely reviewed. This publication incorporates changes to the following areas: guidance on wear of functional clothing, sage green fleece, watch cap, WIT badge, and Flight Clothing Accoutrements. Updated no-hat areas and FDU patch configuration.

2.8.3.1. **(Added)** In Club XL Annexes, indoor MWR facilities (except the fitness center), and in the clinic: Bathing suits, Shoes with metal cleats, Undergarments worn as outer-garments, Ripped, torn, frayed, or patched clothing, Any garments which are see-through and worn without undergarments and/or contain obscene, profane, lewd words and/or drawings.

2.8.3.2. **(Added)** In the fitness center, base picnic areas, swimming pools, and other outdoor recreation facilities: Any garments which are see-through and worn without undergarments and/or contain obscene, profane, lewd words and/or drawings.

2.8.9.1. **(Added)** Security Forces personnel are authorized to wear the Kevlar helmets during exercises, contingencies, or deployments.

2.8.9.2. **(Added)** Mandatory Use of Under Body Armor Shirt Contract: authorized for issue/use without the ABU blouse at home station locations requiring the wear of individual body armor (IBA) for specific missions. When wearing the under armor shirt, a T-shirt is not required. The under body armor shirt will not be worn as an outer garment; when IBA is removed, the ABU blouse must be worn.

2.8.11. **(Added)** Areas designated as “no-hat” areas are listed in Attachment 2.

2.10.1. **(Added)** Squadron Commanders are authorized to determine what is considered extreme or faddish.

6.1.10. **(Added)** *Sage Green Fleece*. Authorized for wear indoors in accordance with 6.1.10.1. Unit Commanders may dictate when indoor wear is inappropriate.

6.2.7. **(Added)** *Black Watch Cap*. Authorized for wear when temperature or wind chill factor falls below fifty degrees Fahrenheit.

6.2.8. **(Added)** *Sage Green Watch Cap*. Authorized for wear when temperature or wind chill factor falls below fifty degrees Fahrenheit.

6.3.5. **(Added)** *Lanyards/Access Passes/Identification Badges/ Common Access Cards (CAC)*. Exercise evaluation team members are authorized to wear a badge with the letters “WIT” during exercise periods.

7.1.1. **(Added)** Approved organizational morale shirts are authorized for wear during organized PT events. The wing commander may delegate approval authority to group commanders or their delegates. Wear of organizational morale shirts will follow guidance in 7.1.4. *T-shirt*.

8.4.7.1 **(Added) Left Sleeve.** The following patches are authorized for wear: U.S. flag emblem, 47 FTW patch, Weapons School Graduate patch, and USAF Test Pilot School patch. Additionally, the First Assignment Instructor Pilot (FAIP) patch is approved for wear on Fridays. Students refer to Attachment 3, Standardized FDU Patch Configuration.

8.4.8.1 **(Added) Right Sleeve.** The following patches are authorized for wear: unit emblem (wing, group, squadron, flight, SUPT class). Aircrew assigned or attached to Wing Safety may wear the Wing Safety patch. OG staff may wear the OG montage patch and the FTW staff may wear the 47 FTW montage patch. Wear of the USAF heraldry Squadron Heritage patch on the right sleeve is approved on Fridays. Students refer to Attachment 3, Standardized FDU Patch Configuration.

APPROVED NO-HAT AREAS

A2.1 The following are designated as no-hat/no-salute areas.

A2.1.1. Covered picnic shelters:

A2.1.1.2. The covered patio at the rear of building 139 and 140 with the exception of individuals participating in or officially observing security forces guard mount activities.

A2.1.1.3. The covered patio on the south side of building 246 (Force Support Squadron).

A2.1.1.4. The covered patio north of building 211.

A2.1.2. The site of any squadron-sponsored function when authorized by the squadron

commander.

A2.1.3. The flight line, which is defined as the area east of First Street to include the parking ramp and CMA (headgear will not be work unless secured by external ear protectors or lanyard).

A2.1.4. The landing, drag, and exercise training area during active training sessions.

A2.1.5. The area between building 136 (Transportation) and the Vehicle Maintenance hangar inside the transportation yard.

A2.1.6. The ground and 2d floor walkway between building 308 (Base Operations Complex) and building 309 (Control Tower).
