**DRESS AND PERSONAL APPEARANCE OF
AIR FORCE PERSONNEL**

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This supplement implements and extends the guidance of AFI 36-2903, *Dress and Personal Appearance of Air Force Personnel* and AFI 36-2903_AETC Supplement, *Dress and Personal Appearance of Air Force Personnel*. This supplement establishes Dress and Appearance policies and standards for Luke Air Force Base (LUKEAFB). This guidance applies to all 56th Fighter Wing (56 FW) personnel, tenant units and agencies. Violations of this instruction can be prosecuted under Article 92 of the *Uniform Code of Military Justice* (UCMJ), as well as any other applicable articles of the UCMJ, when appropriate. This supplement does not change required wear requirements established by AFI 36-2903. This publication applies to the Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) and to Air National Guard (ANG) and their units. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility using the AF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route AF Form 847 from the field through the appropriate functional's chain of command. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with Air Force Manual (AFMAN) 33-363, *Management of Records*, and disposed of in accordance with Air Force Records Information Management System (AFRIMS) Records Disposition Schedule (RDS). The authorities to waive wing/unit level requirements in this publication are identified with a Tier ("T-0, T-1, T-2, T-3") number following the compliance statement. See AFI 33-360, *Publications and Forms Management*, for a description of the authorities associated with the Tier numbers. This publication may not be supplemented or

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SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This revision updates Attachment 8. Update Operations Group; realign Medical Group alphabet numbering sequence, and delete “Tenant Unit” from Attachment 8.

1.3.7. **(Added)** Dining Facility Dress Codes. The following dress code policy will be enforced in all Luke Air Force Base dining facilities as applicable:

1.3.7.1. **(Added)** The Falcon Inn (flight line kitchen) is considered an immediate work area for flight line personnel and flight line Airmen may wear Airman Battle Uniforms (ABUs) without shirt/blouse or hat while traveling directly to/from the facility for meals when approaching from the flight line west side (see Attachment 8, item m). The Hensman Dining Facility is not included in this authorization.

1.3.7.2. **(Added)** Shirts and footwear must be worn. Headgear, du-rag/wave caps, sleeveless shirts, and pajama bottoms are prohibited.

1.3.7.3. **(Added)** Fitness clothes drenched in sweat, filthy or tattered clothing, swimwear, extremely short shorts/skirts, or clothing with obscenities will not be permitted inside the dining facility. All clothing should be in good taste and appropriate for all military and civilian citizens.

1.3.7.4. **(Added)** Personnel not dressed appropriately will be asked to leave and change to appropriate attire.

6.2.7.4. **(Added)** Black Watch Cap. Between 1 Oct and 30 Apr of each year, personnel may wear the black wool watch-cap with the physical training uniform (PTU) only.

6.2.8.4. **(Added)** Sage Green Watch Cap. Between 1 Oct and 30 Apr of each year, personnel who normally perform duties outside during cold or inclement weather may wear the sage green watch cap (**only** authorized with ABU) when performing those specific duties. Watch caps will not be worn outside the immediate work areas. Watch caps will not be worn with sleeves rolled up. Sage Green Watch Cap may also be worn with the PTU.

6.2.9.5. **(Added)** To mitigate the potential for aircraft foreign object damage, headgear will not be worn in the following areas: All routinely used runways, taxiways, aircraft parking areas, and other areas where aircraft are routinely towed or parked, and the grounds immediately adjacent to these areas, as well as the areas listed are designated as “NO HAT” areas (see Attachment 8). Aircrew members, when dressed out to fly, who are proceeding directly to and from their primary work facility and the flight line will not wear a hat.

6.3.3.1.1. **(Added)** Sidewalks and running paths on Luke AFB are approved/designated running areas. Head phones are authorized to be worn in these areas. For safety, head phones will be removed when crossing any roadway.

6.3.4.6. **(Added)** Tan, Black or ABU print Personnel Hydration Systems are authorized for wear with the ABU.

6.3.5.1. **(Added)** Clothing/Accessory Standards: Base exercise evaluation team (EET) members are authorized wear of the red EET badge during exercise periods only. The badge should be clipped to the left lapel.

6.5.2.3.1. **(Added)** Thermal undergarments (all without pockets) in desert tan, white, or cream colored may be worn under the ABU shirt as weather conditions warrant. None of these may be worn by themselves as an outer garment, outside of authorized work area and must not be visible under the ABU/Flight Duty Uniform (FDU) trouser legs and/or coat except at the neck. All must be tucked into the trousers. (EXCEPTION: tucking of t-shirt or turtleneck is not required if wearing maternity ABUs).

8.4.5.1. **(Added)** Flight Suit Name Tags: Name tags on flight suits will be 2-inch by 4-inch cloth in Wing, Group, or Squadron colors in accordance with (IAW) Attachment 9, Name tags may also include squadron commander approved small logo or aircraft silhouette. In addition, FMS aircrew may wear a small patch on the left sleeve pocket of their suit with their given call sign. On Fridays or the last duty day of the week, aircrew are authorized to wear call-sign nametags IAW Attachment 10. Call sign nametags will only be worn in squadron operational areas to include Club 56 for applicable morale and social events.

8.4.10.1. **(Added)** Neckwear is authorized IAW Attachment 11.

9.1.1.1. **(Added)** Personnel are authorized to wear coveralls (white, blue, or green) as Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) gear when working in industrial areas. White coveralls used for aircraft intake and exhaust inspections will conform to LUKEAFBI 21-107, *Preventing Foreign Object Damage* and AFI 21-101, *Aircraft and Equipment Maintenance Management*.

9.1.1.2. **(Added)** Coveralls will only be worn in the immediate work area facility or the designated "NO HAT/NO SALUTE" areas. Commuting through unauthorized areas wearing coveralls is prohibited. Exception: Coveralls may be worn to the flightline kitchen area when accessed from the west side of the facility (industrial areas) for the purpose of obtaining food and immediately returning to the industrial work areas.

9.1.1.2.1. **(Added)** Building 945 (supply) is considered the immediate work area for flight line maintenance personnel for the purposes noted. Coveralls may be worn when traveling by vehicle to building 945 (supply), and to enter and exit the storage and issue entrance to building 945 (west side) for purpose of aircraft parts pickup and drop-off. In addition, the absence of the ABU top is acceptable when traveling by vehicle to building 945 (supply) and to enter and exit the storage and issue entrance of building 945 (west side) for the purpose of aircraft parts pickup and drop off.

9.1.1.2.2. **(Added)** Coveralls must be in good repair, zipped, buttoned or velcro. Sleeves may be tailored or neatly rolled for summer wear. If tailored, the sleeves will barely touch or come within one inch of the forearm with the elbow bent at

90 degrees. Half coveralls are authorized.

9.1.1.3. **(Added)** Name tape, United States Air Force/Occupational tape and grade insignia is optional on blue or green coveralls issued to individuals. Combinations authorized are: none or all.

9.1.1.3.1. **(Added)** Name tapes will be worn on the right side and contain the last name of the individual in standard, all caps block lettering.

9.1.1.3.2. **(Added)** USAF tape or Occupational tapes may be worn on the left side and contain standard all caps block lettering. Dedicated Crew Chiefs and Assistant Dedicated Crew Chiefs may also include their assigned aircraft number (i.e., DCC 2056, ADCC 2056).

9.1.1.3.3. **(Added)** Green coveralls will use subdued tapes and insignia as authorized for the ABU uniform. Blue coveralls will have blue tape with white lettering. If chevrons are used, they must be 4-inch. Unless otherwise stated, position and format will conform as closely as possible to requirements for ABUs in AFI 36-2903.

9.1.1.4. **(Added)** Squadron commanders are responsible to ensure standardization amongst assigned units on coverall as PPE gear options listed in this supplement.

9.1.1.4.1. **(Added)** Individuals working on aircraft wash racks are authorized to wear Tan cotton or nylon shorts of a subdued color. Cut off shorts are not authorized. Wet weather gear will be provided as PPE gear for wash rack employees when temperatures fall (or forecasted) below 75 degrees Fahrenheit.

9.6.2.1. **(Added)** The 56th Security Forces Squadron Commander may authorize the wear of the brassard (arm band) while performing security force augmentee duties.

- a. The fenced-in aerospace ground equipment wash rack and storage areas just south of building 930A and the maintenance yard north of building 404 to include AGE fuel pumps.
- b. The fenced-in area around the fuel barn (building 968) and inside the tank farm.
- c. All areas within the Munitions Storage Area fence.
- d. The area south of building 913, including the cart maintenance area.
- e. Between buildings 930 and 931 (Engine shop and Module Repair Shop), when moving engines, modules, or equipment.
- f. Between buildings 920 and 926 when performing maintenance or moving equipment.
- g. Between buildings 930A, 404, and the wash racks, when performing maintenance or moving equipment.
- h. 56 Maintenance Group Quality Assurance inspectors are exempt from wearing a hat when leaving or approaching from the east side of building 959 or while traveling in a golf cart with the specific intention of traveling to or from the flight line in performance of duties that require access to the flight line. No other exceptions are authorized.
- i. Fuels Operation complex.
- j. Alternate Fuel Barn.
- k. The area east of building 915.
- l. The area north and west of buildings 405, 406, and 410.
- m. Building 954 Flight line Carry Out when entered from the west side industrial areas.
- n. Building 945 Supply in execution of assigned duties i.e. parts pick up/drop off.

- o. Buildings 289, 291, and 299. The areas within the slump block wall enclosure bounded by Litchfield Road, Bong Lane, Lightning Street, and Mitchell Street.
- p. The area between buildings 909 and 918 (Combat Arms Training and Maintenance).
- q. The covered break area east of building 179.
- r. Main civil engineers slump-block-wall enclosed compound north and west of building 343 and west and north of building 339.
- s. Power production chain-linked fence enclosed compound south, west and east of building 360.
- t. Explosive Ordnance Disposal slump-block-wall enclosed compound south of building 984.
- u. Area west of building 950 (surface cargo terminal compound).
- v. Building 945 receiving yard; the docks and parking area located on the south side of building 945 when loading and unloading government property.
