This instruction implements and extends local laws and ordinances. It establishes a curfew for military family members, civilian family members and civilian guests in the housing and dormitory areas at Luke Air Force Base. It also establishes control to preclude entry into the housing and dormitory areas by individuals who have no authority or official business to be in the area. This instruction applies to all 56th Fighter Wing personnel and tenant units. This publication applies to all Air Force, Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) and to Air National Guard (ANG) units. This publication applies to all persons within the boundary of Luke Air Force Base (AFB). Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility using the AF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route AF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional's chain of command. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with Air Force Manual (AFMAN) 33-363, *Management of Records*, and disposed of in accordance with Air Force Records Information Management System (AFRIMS) Records Disposition Schedule (RDS). This publication may not be supplemented or further implemented/extended. The authorities to waive wing/unit level requirements in this publication are identified with a Tier ("T-0, T-1, T-2, T-3") number following the compliance statement. See AFI 33-360, *Publications and Forms Management*, for a description of the authorities associated with the Tier numbers. The use of the name or mark of any specific manufacturer, commercial product, commodity, or service in this publication does not imply endorsement by the Air Force.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This publication has been minimally revised and must be completely reviewed. Changes include acronyms, forms and references. Ages and times of curfew have changed.

1. Identification: All military family members ten years of age and older will have their DD Form 1173, Uniformed Service Identification and Privilege Card, with them at all times as required by AFI 36-3026 V1 IP, *Identification Cards for Members of Uniformed Services, Their Eligible Family Members and Other Eligible Personnel*.

2. Reference: Glendale Code, Article III, Division 1, Section 26-53.

3. Curfew:

3.1. Family members or civilians. Family member or civilians of the following ages will not be allowed on the streets of Luke AFB, including the housing and dormitory areas, unless accompanied by a parent or legal guardian during the hours indicated below:

3.1.1. Minors under 16 years of age may not be outside unsupervised between 2200 and 0500. Minors 16-18 years of age may not be outside unsupervised between 0000 and 0500.

3.1.2. Civilians 17 years of age or younger are not authorized in dormitories at any time.

3.2. Exceptions:

3.2.1. Newspaper employees while delivering papers.

3.2.2. Family members and their guests returning directly home to base housing after attending a special function which was previously sanctioned by the base and coordinated with Security Forces. Special functions shall include, but are not limited to, late movies, away game sporting events, dances, and special shows or events.

4. Violations. Personnel found in violation of the curfew will be detained.

4.1. **Family Members.** Parents will be contacted and requested to respond and receipt for the minor.

4.2. **Civilians.** Civil authorities will be contacted to assume control of the situation.

5. Report Requirements. For family members and civilian visitors violators, accomplish a detailed blotter entry. If an offense other than a curfew violation was committed by a family member, contact civil authorities to assume control of the situation.
