This instruction implements Air Force Policy Directive (AFPD) 48-1, *Aerospace Medicine Enterprise*, Air Force Joint Instruction (AFJI) 48-104, *Quarantine Regulations of the Armed Forces*, USDA 7 CFR 319.56 *Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, Department of Agriculture (Agriculture)*, USDA 9 CFR 94.5 *Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service, Department of Agriculture (Animals and Animal Products)*, CDC 42 CFR Parts 70 & 71 *Control of Communicable Diseases*, and *Homeland Security National Response Plan*. It references DODD 6200.3, *Emergency Health Powers on Military Installations*. It establishes procedures for the inspection of aircraft arriving from an origin outside the Continental United States (CONUS). A military customs inspection as well as an agriculture and public health briefing, will be given by Security Forces personnel to all crew and passengers. This is necessary to prevent the introduction of diseases requiring quarantine or arthropod vectors of medical importance into the United States and to prevent the spread of economic pests. This instruction applies to all personnel assigned or attached to Luke Air Force Base to include Air Force Reserve Command and to Air National Guard Units. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility using the AF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route AF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional's chain of command. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with (IAW) Air Force Manual (AFMAN) 33-363, *Management of Records*, and disposed of IAW Air Force Records Disposition Schedule (RDS) located in the Air Force Records Information Management System

(AFRIMS). The use of the name or mark of any specific manufacturer, commercial product, commodity, or service in this publication does not imply endorsement by the Air Force.

### ***SUMMARY OF CHANGES***

Updated the term Base Operations to Airfield Management. Revised role of Public Health and Flight Physician in the event of illness in passengers; Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and state health department take the lead while Public Health and Flight Physician provide support. Added CDC EOC 24 hr phone number. Updated paragraphs 1.1., 1.3.4., 1.3.4.1., 1.3.4.2., 1.5., 1.5.1. and 1.5.2. Added 1.3.4.3. Removed 1.5.3., 1.5.4., and 1.5.5.

#### **1. Responsibilities.**

##### 1.1. Airfield Management will:

1.1.1. Immediately upon notification of an aircraft arriving at Luke AFB from an origin outside of the CONUS, notify Security Forces at 623-856-5970, Public Health at 623-856-6174/6176, during normal duty hours or after-hours at 602-821-8890, and on-call Flight Physician at 623-363-9193. The following information will be provided:

1.1.2. Aircraft point of origin.

1.1.3. Aircraft type, call sign and tail number, if available.

1.1.4. Estimated time of arrival.

1.1.5. Aircraft parking spot.

1.1.6. Number of passengers, if information is available.

1.1.7. Any illness of passengers, if available.

1.1.8. Amount of cargo, if available.

##### 1.2. Security Forces personnel will:

1.2.1. Notify U.S. Customs & Border Protection (U.S. C.B.P.) at 602-392-4440 extension 2, between the hours of 0800 to 2000. After duty hours, and weekends, call 1-800-973-2867.

1.2.2. Send Customs Declaration to U.S. C.B.P. within 72 hours.

1.2.3. Brief crew and passengers on customs and quarantine.

1.2.4. Inspect baggage and aircraft using military working dog specializing in drug detection when available. (The Military Working Dog team does not always need to be used to inspect baggage. The use of this team depends on the availability and origination of flight.)

1.2.5. Perform visual open inspection of passengers' baggage as required. Aircraft Commander will ensure passengers and crew do not leave the plane before authorized by the Military Customs Inspector.

1.2.6. Collect and review customs declarations DD Form 1854 or CBP Form 6059B.

1.2.7. Call U.S. C.B.P. at 602-392-4440 extension 2, for answers to questions regarding the customs inspection.

1.3. Public Health personnel will:

1.3.1. Report to Airfield Management (bldg. 453) to get clearance to approach aircraft.

1.3.2. Consult with aircrew chief to ensure international garbage (i.e., fruits, meats, food items) are secured by the aircrew staff.

1.3.2.1. Collect international garbage from aircrew staff, place in hazardous waste bags and properly tie off bags.

1.3.2.2. Hazardous waste bags will be transported and placed in the Stericycle container located at the back loading dock area at 56th Medical Group.

1.3.2.3. Contact Medical Group Logistics Office at 623-856-4091 the first hour of the next duty day to inform them of the garbage collected from the overseas flight. Medical logistics will coordinate with the contractor (Stericycle Inc. at 1-866-783-7422) to have the international garbage properly disposed of.

1.3.2.4. In the event of a large spill that can't be expediently cleaned with household bleach, contact the Emergency Operations Center at 623-856-8275 to arrange for contracted spill response. For spills inside the aircraft contact U.S. C.B.P. Agriculture Specialist at 602-392-4440 extension 4.

1.3.3. If U.S. C.B.P. Inspector finds evidence of pest infestation, advise 56th Civil Engineering Squadron, Pest Management at 623-856-3961 during normal duty hours and 623-856-6641 after 1700 hours and on weekends/holidays. Pest infestation issues should be addressed expediently.

1.3.4. In the event of reported illness, notify the Public Health Flight Commander who will:

1.3.4.1. Notify the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Quarantine Division, San Diego at (619) 692-5665 or Los Angeles, at (310) 215-2365. The 24 hour quarantine duty officer may be reached via the CDC EOC at (866) 638-9753. The CDC quarantine duty officer will coordinate with the state and local health department. The 24 hour hotline for Maricopa County Department of Public Health is 602-747-7111.

1.3.4.2. Provide support to the CDC and health department for illness interview and contact tracing.

1.3.4.3. Notify/consult with Flight Physician on-call and Chief of Aerospace Medicine (SGP) on disease findings and gathered data.

1.4. Civil Engineering will:

1.4.1. Disinsect aircraft upon discovery of pests.

1.5. Flight Physician.

1.5.1. In the event of reported illness, Flight Physician on-call will:

1.5.2. Provide support to the CDC and health department for evaluation and testing of ill passengers.

1.5.3. Report ill passengers' medical status to 56th Medical Group Commander and 56th Aerospace Medicine Squadron Commander/SGP and arrange for admittance/follow-up care as deemed necessary.

1.6. 56<sup>TH</sup> Fighter Wing.

1.6.1. 56th Fighter Wing Commander will direct quarantine procedures with assistance from the 56th Medical Group Commander, using DODD 6200.3, *Emergency Health Powers on Military Installations*.
