

Trainee/Student Rights and Duties

As a Trainee or Student, you will commit to the following Rights and Duties. The Department of the Air Force (AF) can only accomplish its mission if the following principles are embraced:	Trainee or Student Acknowledgment Initials		
1. Our community must be free of discrimination, harassment, intimidation, or threats based on race, color, religion, national origin, and gender. Any conduct that creates an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment will be reported, and action will be taken to eliminate the behavior.			
2. Retaliation will not be tolerated.			
3. We insist on impartial and professional conduct by leaders at every level. We do not tolerate the use of rank or position to threaten or pressure you. We do not tolerate the promise of favorable treatment in return for personal favors. We are determined to ensure that your relationship with your leadership be completely and solely professional.			
4. We expect all leaders and peers to promote the principles of equal opportunity and impartiality. Living up to these principles is integral to our core values. We are personally committed to this endeavor and expect the same commitment from you.			
5. This is a professional military training environment. As a trainee or student of the DAF, you will be expected to share these values and maintain a professional relationship throughout the training process. You will not engage or attempt to engage in anything other than a professional relationship with any member of the training cadre. This includes military training instructors, military training leaders, and any other member of the training squadron staff, civilian or military.			
6. DD Form 2983, <i>Recruit/Trainee Prohibited Activities Acknowledgment</i> , contains a list of prohibited activities. These prohibited activities are applicable from the date on which the prospective member becomes a member of the DAF and for six (6) months after the trainee/student, following graduation from initial skills training, reports to the trainee's/student's first permanent duty station of assignment or follow-on training program. The same prohibitions apply to instructors/staff with a direct training relationship with advanced skills students from the first day of training through graduation or completion of the training program or course of instruction.			
7. You should never feel that submission to unprofessional conduct is required or a condition of completing your Basic Military Training, technical training, or award of your specialty code. Immediately report any inappropriate conduct by any DAF military or civilian member. The phone numbers to report suspected inappropriate conduct are included on the wallet card/digital equivalent you received.			
8. You also have a responsibility to your peers. As a member of the DAF, you will treat other trainees and students with dignity and respect. You will not engage in, nor tolerate in others behavior that intimidates, belittles, or demeans your fellow trainees or students, whether verbal or physical.
