This mission directive implements guidance in AFI 38-101, *Manpower and Organization*. Its purpose is to prescribe the mission and responsibilities of the 99th Air Base Wing (99 ABW). This mission directive applies to active-duty military and civilians assigned to 99 ABW. It does not apply to Air Force Reserve Command, Air National Guard, or United States Space Force units. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained IAW AFI 33-322, *Records Management and Information Governance Program*, and disposed of IAW the Air Force Records Information Management System Records Disposition Schedule. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Responsibility (OPR) using DAF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route DAF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command. Air Combat Command Director of Operations (ACC/A3) is the waiver authority for compliance items in this publication. Submit requests for waivers through the chain of command to the publication OPR for consideration. This publication may not be supplemented or further implemented/extended.

1. Mission. The 99 ABW delivers base operational support to the Combat Air Force's premier Test, Tactics Development, and Training missions. The 99 ABW oversees two groups: 99th Medical Group (MDG) and the 99th Mission Support Group (MSG). The 99 ABW enables the installation as a power projection platform, supporting flying operations and tenant unit missions, operating the base through competition, crisis or conflict, and providing care and support for the base and the larger military community.

2. Command. The 99 ABW is organized under the USAF Warfare Center (USAFWC) and Air Combat Command (ACC). ACC/A3 oversees policy for the 99 ABW mission, coordinates with

the 99 ABW on mission execution, and maintains Lead Command functions per DAFPD 10-9, *Lead Command/Lead Agent Designation and Responsibilities for United States Air Force Weapon Systems, Non- Weapon Systems, and Activities*.

3. Responsibilities.

3.1. The 99 ABW is responsible for mission execution, discipline, morale, and welfare of assigned personnel.

3.2. The 99 ABW supports over 17,000 assigned Nellis personnel, the greater Nellis community of over 330,000 military, dependents, retirees, and civilians, and approximately 20,000 TDY personnel annually.

3.3. The 99 ABW supports the USAFWC, 57th Wing, Nevada Test and Training Range, 926th Wing, units assigned to the 53d Wing and 505th Command and Control Wing, as well as Creech AFB and over 50 Mission Partners.

3.4. The 99 ABW supports USAFWC-sponsored Air Force, Joint, and Coalition Command and Control (C2) Exercises and other large force exercises (LFEs) as directed by the Air Force and Commander, Air Combat Command (COMACC).

3.5. The 99 ABW supports Nellis-based tenant wings' Large Force Test Events (LFTE), operational test and evaluation missions, fielding of new capabilities, and cybersecurity assessments in coordination with ACC and the Air Force Operational Test and Evaluation Center (AFOTEC) for AF C2 and Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance (ISR) weapons systems.

3.6. The 99 ABW supports Nellis-based Air Force, Joint, and Coalition Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures (TTP) development.

3.6.1. Supports C2 Summits.

3.6.2. Supports Weapons School phases and Weapons School Integration (WSINT).

3.6.3. Supports Weapons and Tactics (WEPTAC) conferences.

3.7. Ensures 99 ABW units with assigned Mission Essential Tasks (METs) are organized, trained, equipped, inspected, and ready for their combat/deployed taskings.

3.8. Provides additional support as directed by ACC.
