This Mission Directive implements guidance in AFI 38-101, *Manpower and Organization*. It prescribes the mission and responsibilities of the 700th Air Support Squadron (700 ASUS) and applies to individuals assigned to ACC. This mission directive does not apply to the Air Force Reserve Command, Air National Guard, or United States Space Force. Ensure all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained IAW AFI 33-322, *Records Management and Information Governance Program*, and disposed of IAW the Air Force Records Information Management System Records Disposition Schedule. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the OPR using DAF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route DAF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command. Submit requests for waivers through the chain of command to the publication OPR for non-tiered compliance items. This publication may not be supplemented or further implemented or extended.

**SUMMARY OF CHANGES**

This publication proposes significant revisions to **paragraph 1**. Mission and **paragraph 3**. Responsibilities.

**1. Mission.** The mission of the 700 ASUS is to provide persistent enterprise services to improve and integrate warfighter capability across Air Components and their joint or coalition partners across the globe. The 700 ASUS offers continuity of operations options, operational data backup and reach-back support, and enterprise support to Air Force Forces (AFFOR) staff, Air Operations Centers (AOCs), Operations Centers (OCs) and associated weapons systems to support worldwide operational command and control (C2). The vision of the 700 ASUS is to preserve and enhance the USAF's worldwide ability to execute command and control, anytime, anywhere.

**2. Command.** The 700 ASUS is a Primary Subordinate Unit reporting directly to Commander Air Combat Command (COMACC). HQ ACC/A3 provides administrative coordination of the 700 ASUS.

**3. Responsibilities.** The 700 ASUS Commander shall provide support to operational-level C2 organizations within Air Components defined as Geographic AOCs, Functional AOCs, Operation OCs, AFFOR staffs, aligned and supporting Air Force Reserve and Air National Guard equivalent organizations, and other Air Component enterprise agencies. The 700 ASUS manages Ryan Center (Joint Base Langley-Eustis, Virginia) security and facilities on behalf of ACC. The 700 ASUS is responsible to provide four distinct supporting responsibilities.

3.1. Provide support to ensure continuity of mission essential operations as required for Air Component enterprise assets IAW DAFI 10-208, *Continuity of Operations (COOP) Program*, requirements. This includes providing physical and virtual support for COOP. Additionally, ASUS provides direct support in the form of operational reach-back, distributed operations and/or federated operations as defined by the supported Air Component agreements such as Memoranda of Agreement (MOA), Memoranda of Understanding (MOU). This support includes, but is not limited to, Air Tasking Order (ATO)/Airspace Control Order (ACO) production/dissemination, database management, and datalink support.

3.2. Develop data backup standards for supporting mission critical functions and enabling cross-theater support capability.

3.2.1. Provide resilient, secure, and redundant storage for real-time data back-up.

3.2.2. Provide data reach-back capability for remote access to mission essential information.

3.2.3. Enable connectivity and bandwidth for data exports and other mission critical AOC and AFFOR products to include AOC Division and Specialty/Support Team Weapon System data as well as AOC and AFFOR staff/mission products, overlays, Microsoft Office templates/files, etc.

3.2.4. Validate customer data backup integrity and ensure forward and backward compatibility.

3.3. Provide enterprise support activities for Air Component operations.

3.3.1. Support enterprise Help Desk activities by providing Tier 1 operations, as outlined in DAFMAN 13-1AOC, Volume 3, *Operational Procedures-Air Operations Center (AOC) Operations Center (OC)*, and as determined by ACC's (Lead Command) AOC Block 20 Management Plan.

3.3.2. Provide Air Components a Command-and-Control Network & Security Operation Center (C2NSOC) to protect and defend data, communications, network equipment, and

services across the DAF Battle Network. This includes central status reporting/network management function for AOCs.

3.3.3. Serve as executive agent to manage AOC hardware nodes at Ryan Center at Joint Base Langley Eustis.

3.4. Provide Air Component non-operational, reach back in support of HQ ACC initiatives.

3.4.1. In coordination with ACC/A3C and 505 Command and Control Wing (CCW), provide a US-only (non-foreign partners) baseline operational AOC Weapon System to support Air Component annual training requirements.

3.4.2. Recommend database and file management standards to ACC (Lead Command) based on AOC weapons system management and integration.

3.4.3. Provide Cyber and C2 personnel support for enterprise training, test, and experimentation organizations.

3.4.4. Provide operator and/or Help Desk subject matter expert support to operational risk assessments of AOC applications or infrastructure updates to the AOC enterprise.

3.4.5. Provide C2 and Cyber personnel and expertise to support training and exercise events.

3.4.6. Support ACC staff assistance visits (SAVs).
