This publication supports Department of the Air Force Policy Directive (DAFPD) 36-26, *Total Force Development and Management*. This pamphlet sets the guidelines and expectations for Noncommissioned Officer and Senior Noncommissioned Officer induction ceremonies and the Senior Enlisted Leader Change of Responsibility ceremony. It applies to the Regular Air Force, Air Force Reserve, and the Air National Guard. This publication does not apply to the United States Space Force. Installations should utilize this pamphlet when planning and conducting these ceremonies. Ensure all records generated as a result of processes prescribed in this publication adhere to Air Force Instruction (AFI) 33-322, Records Management and Information Governance Program, and are disposed in accordance with the Air Force Records Disposition Schedule, which is located in the Air Force Records Information Management System. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the office of primary responsibility (OPR) using the DAF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route DAF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command.

1. Overview.

- 1.1. The Noncommissioned Officer (NCO) and Senior Noncommissioned Officer (SNCO) are members of the armed services who have been recognized as Airmen leaders and are a core element in the chain of command. Achieving the rank of SSgt and MSgt are significant in an Airman's career and honoring these milestones are necessary to preserve our Core Values, culture & heritage, and legacy as an enlisted force.
- 1.2. When practical and feasible, installations will host NCO and SNCO Induction Ceremonies after the annual SSgt and MSgt public promotion releases. An installation-wide event including all applicable total force units is optimal and should be considered. The date of the ceremony will be at the discretion of installation leadership. Supplemental promotion releases will not require an additional induction ceremony. Airmen on supplemental promotion lists should be inducted during the next scheduled ceremony.
- 1.3. When practical and feasible, a "Change of Responsibility" Ceremony should be held to signify the transition of a Senior Enlisted Leader (SEL) and highlight the role and responsibility this entails. This ceremony should take place when responsibility has shifted from the outgoing to the incoming SEL.
- 1.4. The following sections of this pamphlet provide a minimum expectation for each ceremony and is deliberately not intended to be prescriptive on "how" each ceremony is conducted. While similarities exist between the inductions, planning committees must ensure there is a clear delineation between an NCO and SNCO Induction. Airman Leadership School graduations will not take the place of an NCO Induction Ceremony and vice versa.

2. Noncommissioned Officer Induction Ceremony.

2.1. General. The NCO Induction Ceremony uniquely recognizes the transition of a Junior Enlisted Airman as they join the ranks of the professional NCO corps. The ceremony celebrates the accomplishments of these Airmen, and highlights the additional responsibilities now held by, and expected of, these leaders. The ceremony also allows for team development and strengthens the bond between fellow NCOs. As such, this transition should be shared among superiors, peers, subordinates, friends, and family.

Note: Hazing or rite of passage-type rituals must never be associated with these ceremonies. Command teams will have zero tolerance for any activities of this nature.

2.1.1. Sequence of Events. **Attachment 5, Figure A5.1** provides a recommended sequence of events. Installations are encouraged to tailor the event to fit their unique mission and/or local community. To encourage max participation, the NCO Induction Ceremony should be held during or at the end of the duty day. Local leadership should

determine uniform requirements. Uniform of the Day is acceptable. **Attachment 6, Figure A6.1** provides a recommended NCO Induction Script.

- 2.1.2. Story of an NCO Act of Valor or Heroism. (See **Attachment 5, Figure A5.1**.) This serves to emphasize the importance of the NCO Tier and the impact an NCO can have. If used, the profile of an NCO who displayed an act of valor or heroism is read aloud to reinforce our culture of heritage and exemplify what it means to be a member of the Profession of Arms.
- 2.1.3. NCO Induction Certificate. **Attachment 2, Figure A2.1** provides an example of an induction certificate. Installations are encouraged to utilize these examples to create their own certificates, keeping in mind the significance of the induction ceremony while developing them.

2.2. Senior Noncommissioned Officer Induction Ceremony.

2.2.1. General. The SNCO Induction Ceremony formally acknowledges the transition of an NCO to the highest tier of enlisted leadership. The ceremony signifies the shift of NCOs to operational leaders, stands to celebrate the accomplishments of these Airmen, and highlights the increased responsibilities now held by, and expected of, the Senior Enlisted tier. The ceremony also allows for team development and strengthens the bond between fellow NCOs. As such, this transition should be shared among superiors, peers, subordinates, friends, and family.

Note: Hazing or rite of passage-type rituals must never be associated with these ceremonies. Command teams will have zero tolerance for any activities of this nature.

- 2.2.2. Sequence of Events. **Attachment 5, Figure A5.2** provides a recommended sequence of events. Installations are encouraged to tailor the event to fit their unique mission and/or local community. When practical and to differentiate the elevated milestone of achieving the MSgt rank, the SNCO Induction Ceremony should be held in the evening and include dinner with the attire being Mess Dress or Semi-Formal. **Attachment 7, Figure A7.1** provides a recommended SNCO Induction Script.
- 2.2.3. Story of a SNCO Act of Valor or Heroism. (See **Attachment 5, Figure A5.2.**.) This serves to emphasize the importance of the SNCO Tier and the impact that a SNCO can have. If used, the profile of a SNCO who displayed an act of valor or heroism is read aloud to reinforce our culture of heritage and exemplify what it means to be a member of the Profession of Arms.
- 2.2.4. Sword Arch. This serves as a symbolic representation of crossing into the next tier and is designed to add military professionalism and decorum to the event. Published procedures for Sword Arch requirements can be found at https://www.honorguard.af.mil.
- 2.2.5. SNCO Induction Certificate. **Attachment 2, Figure A2.2** provides an example of an induction certificate. Installations are encouraged to utilize these examples to create their own certificates, keeping in mind the significance of the induction ceremony while developing them.

2.3. Senior Enlisted Leader Change of Responsibility.

2.3.1. General. The change of responsibility is a traditional event that is rich with symbolism and heritage. The key to the ceremony is the passing of the unit's colors (see paragraph 2.3.3.) The colors symbolize the lineage and honors of the unit, and also the loyalty and unity of its Airmen. This demonstrates to the formation that the responsibility has passed to the new Senior Enlisted Leader, and with this also passes the SEL's charge to uphold the discipline, readiness, and welfare of the organization's enlisted force. Attachment 8, Figure A8.1 provides a proposed script for change of responsibility ceremonies.

Note: Change of Responsibility ceremonies for Senior Enlisted Leaders below the wing level can be performed but will not receive official funding. Protocol offices will only serve to advise and guide the event's assigned OPR and project/action officer. Refer to AFI 34-1201, *Protocol*. paragraph 1.3.6.1.1.. regarding guidance in supporting events hosted by Major Command, Numbered Air Force/Direct Reporting Unit, or Wing command team members.

- 2.3.1.1. SELs who lead alongside a commander, on G-series orders, are the keeper of the unit's colors. Senior NCOs assigned to an authorized position, no lower than a squadron level, are authorized to have a Change of Responsibility Ceremony. SELs who assume the responsibilities of the unit's SEL position in an interim role are not authorized to have a ceremony, no matter the length of time they fill the position.
- 2.3.2. Core Elements of Ceremony. Understanding that each ceremony will vary based on commander's intent, there should be core elements of each event when performed. The commander should highlight the outgoing SEL's accomplishments, welcome the new SEL, and present the flag for safe keeping on the commander's behalf.
- 2.3.3. The passing of the unit colors or guidon from an outgoing Senior Enlisted Leader, through the commander, to an incoming Senior Enlisted Leader, highlights to the unit the SEL will ensure the safety and care of the flag and its Airmen.

Noncommissioned Officers are the backbone of the United States Air Force and bear the profound responsibility of structural integrity of the enterprise. The Noncommissioned Officer ranks of Staff Sergeant and Technical Sergeant mark a transition of leadership in duties and responsibilities.

You are charged to serve as a blueprint of leadership by exemplifying self-discipline, proactively seeking opportunities for growth and advancing your Airmen's capabilities.

You are charged to aggressively execute the intent and priorities of your chain of command, while developing company grade officers to build expertise and leadership fundamentals. Seek guidance when needed and offer solutions to problems within your purview.

You are charged to embrace our Core Values and strictly adhere to Air Force expectations and standards, ensuring that your actions and those of your team are in full compliance to best foster an environment of trust, mutual respect, shared understanding, and unit cohesion.

You are charged to strive for excellence, demonstrating the highest standards of character, competence, professionalism, and discipline. In all aspects of your duty continually assess to improve your own performance and that of your team.

Your role as a Noncommissioned Officer is pivotal in equipping and readying our fighting formations. In accepting these responsibilities, you pledge your dedication to the United States Air Force and its enduring mission for our Nation to Fly, Fight and Win – Airpower anytime, anywhere!

You are charged with honoring our heritage while also serving as a leader for the next generation. Embrace our Core Values while modeling a comprehensive knowledge of Air Force foundational competencies.

You are charged with cultivating a professional climate and culture within your teams, enforcing high standards and combined focus on mission execution. Clarify leadership orders, expectations, and swiftly correct behaviors that detract from good order and discipline.

NARRATOR 2: "LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, PLEASE STAND FOR THE ARRIVAL OF OUR OFFICIAL PARTY AND REMAIN STANDING FOR THE PLAYING OF THE NATIONAL ANTHEM, FOLLOWED BY THE INVOCATION LED BY (INSERT CHAPLAIN)."

*** COLORS PREPOSTED FOR NATIONAL ANTHEM***

NARRATOR 1: "THANK YOU (INSERT CHAPLAIN). LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, PLEASE BE SEATED."

OPENING NARRATION

NARRATOR 1: GOOD AFTERNOON AND WELCOME TO THE (INSERT INSTALLATION NAME) NONCOMMISSIONED OFFICER INDUCTION CEREMONY. I AM (INSERT NARRATOR) FROM THE (INSERT SQUADRON) AND YOUR EMCEE FOR THIS EVENING.

OUR HOSTS FOR THIS EVENING ARE THE COMMANDER, (INSERT UNIT OF COMMAND), COLONEL JOHN SMITH, ACCOMPANIED BY HIS WIFE, MRS. JANE SMITH AND THE COMMAND CHIEF, (INSERT UNIT OF RESPONSIBILITY), CHIEF MASTER SERGEANT JANE DOE, ACCOMPANIED BY HER HUSBAND, MR. JOHN DOE.

(LEAD APPLAUSE)

WE ALSO WANT TO RECOGNIZE AND WELCOME THE FAMILY MEMBERS OF OUR PROMOTEES WHO ARE IN ATTENDANCE TONIGHT. WITHOUT YOUR SACRIFICE AND DEVOTION, THIS ACCOMPLISHMENT WOULD NOT BE POSSIBLE.

(LEAD APPLAUSE)

NARRATOR 1: LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, TODAY WE ARE GATHERED TO CELEBRATE A MOMENTOUS OCCASION, A SIGNIFICANT MILESTONE IN THE CAREERS OF OUR DEDICATED AND ACCOMPLISHED NONCOMMISSIONED OFFICERS. THIS INDUCTION CEREMONY IS A TESTAMENT TO THE UNWAVERING COMMITMENT AND EXCEPTIONAL QUALITIES THAT DEFINE THE AIRMEN WHO ARE CHOSEN TO LEAD.

THE ROLE OF A NONCOMMISSIONED OFFICER IS NO ORDINARY ONE, IT STANDS WITH PROFOUND IMPORTANCE WITHIN OUR RANKS. IT REPRESENTS THE PINNACLE OF OUR AIR FORCE CORE VALUES, EMBODYING INTEGRITY FIRST, SERVICE BEFORE SELF, AND EXCELLENCE IN ALL WE DO. IT IS A ROLE THAT CARRIES IMMENSE RESPONSIBILITY AND HONOR.

THE NONCOMMISSIONED OFFICER'S YOU WILL SEE TODAY HAVE EXEMPLIFIED THE ESSENCE OF SERVICE. THEY HAVE DISPLAYED EXCEPTIONAL LEADERSHIP, SELFLESSNESS, TIRELESS DEDICATION, TO THE AIR FORCE, OUR NATION, AND OUR MISSION TO FLIGHT, FIGHT, AND WIN.

WE ALSO SERVE TO HONOR THE MEMORY OF THOSE MEN AND WOMEN OF THE NCO CORPS WHO HAVE SERVED WITH PRIDE AND DISTINCTION. TODAY, WE REMEMBER ONE OF OUR OWN, ONE WHOSE COURAGE SHOULD NOT GO UNREMEMBERED:

NARRATOR 2: (INSERT STORY OF NCO ACT OF VALOR OR HEROISM)

EXAMPLE:

TECHNICAL SERGEANT JOHN ALLAN CHAPMAN'S HEROISM IN THE BATTLE OF TAKUR GHAR DURING THE WAR IN AFGHANISTAN IS A REMARKABLE AND COURAGEOUS STORY. ON MARCH 4, 2002, AS PART OF OPERATION ANACONDA, HE AND A TEAM OF UNITED STATES NAVY SEALS FACED A DIRE SITUATION WHEN THEIR BOEING CH-47 CHINOOK HELICOPTER CAME UNDER INTENSE ENEMY FIRE. THIS ATTACK CAUSED NAVY SEAL NEIL C. ROBERTS TO FALL FROM THE HELICOPTER, AND THE AIRCRAFT HAD TO MAKE AN EMERGENCY LANDING NEARLY 4.5 MILES AWAY FROM ROBERTS' LOCATION.

CHAPMAN'S SELFLESSNESS AND BRAVERY WERE EVIDENT AS HE PROVIDED VITAL DIRECTIONS TO ANOTHER HELICOPTER, GUIDING IT TO THEIR LANDING SITE. WITHOUT HESITATION, HE AND THE TEAM VOLUNTEERED TO EMBARK ON A PERILOUS MISSION TO RESCUE ROBERTS.

AS THEY RETURNED TO RETRIEVE ROBERTS, THEY FOUND THEMSELVES UNDER HEAVY FIRE FROM THREE DIFFERENT DIRECTIONS. UNDETERRED, CHAPMAN DISPLAYED EXCEPTIONAL VALOR BY CHARGING FORWARD, ENGAGING AND ELIMINATING TWO ENEMY COMBATANTS, ALL WHILE ADVANCING TOWARD A DEFENSIVE ENEMY POSITION WITH MINIMAL PERSONAL COVER. DESPITE SUSTAINING MULTIPLE WOUNDS, HIS FEARLESS ACTIONS PLAYED A PIVOTAL ROLE IN NEUTRALIZING THE FIRST ENEMY POSITION AND ADVANCING TO THE SECOND, ENABLING HIS TEAM TO REACH SAFETY AND BREAK ENEMY CONTACT.

JOHN CHAPMAN'S UNWAVERING COMMITMENT TO THE MISSION AND HIS EXTRAORDINARY ACTS OF HEROISM SAVED THE LIVES OF THE ENTIRE RESCUE TEAM, DEMONSTRATING HIS EXCEPTIONAL DEDICATION TO HIS FELLOW SOLDIERS AND HIS COUNTRY. FOR HIS OUTSTANDING BRAVERY, HE WAS INITIALLY AWARDED THE AIR FORCE CROSS, BECOMING THE FIRST AIR FORCE COMBAT CONTROLLER TO RECEIVE THIS HONOR. SUBSEQUENTLY, HIS AWARD WAS UPGRADED TO THE MEDAL OF HONOR, MAKING HIM THE FIRST AIRMAN TO RECEIVE THIS PRESTIGIOUS RECOGNITION SINCE THE VIETNAM WAR. HIS LEGACY SERVES AS AN ENDURING SYMBOL OF THE COURAGE AND SELFLESSNESS EXHIBITED BY THOSE WHO SERVE IN THE UNITED STATES MILITARY.

WHILE THIS IS ONE SPECIFIC EXAMPLE, IT EXEMPLIFIES THE BRAVERY AND HEROISM DISPLAYED BY AIR FORCE NONCOMMISSIONED OFFICERS THROUGHOUT HISTORY. MANY NCOS HAVE, AND WILL CONTINUE, TO SHOW EXCEPTIONAL COURAGE AND LEADERSHIP IN VARIOUS CHALLENGING SITUATIONS, CONTRIBUTING SIGNIFICANTLY TO THE SUCCESS OF THE AIR FORCE'S MISSIONS."

NARRATOR 2: AT THIS TIME, WE WOULD LIKE TO ASK (INSERT HOSTS) TO PLEASE COME FORWARD TO RECOGNIZE OUR INDUCTEES.

PROFFER MOVES INTO PLACE

AT THIS TIME INDUCTEES AND THEIR ESCORTS WILL GET IN POSITION. WAIT UNTIL THEY ARE READY BEFORE PROCEEDING

NARRATOR 1: LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, PLEASE DIRECT YOUR ATTENTION TO THE MAIN ENTRANCE AND WELCOME OUR NEWEST NONCOMMISSIONED OFFICERS AND THEIR GUESTS. PLEASE FEEL FREE TO CHEER FOR YOUR MEMBERS AS THEY ARE ANNOUNCED.

NARRATOR 2: (NARRATOR WILL ANNOUNCE EACH INDUCTEE AND THEIR ESCORT)

EXAMPLE:

FROM THE (INSERT UNIT NAME), STAFF SERGEANT JANE DOE ACCOMPANIED BY HER SPOUSE JANE DOE.

(LEAD APPLAUSE)

HE DIRECTED AIR STRIKES TO REPEL THE ENEMY AND HELPED EVACUATE WOUNDED COMRADES. WHEN THE EVACUATION HELICOPTER ARRIVED, HE LOADED WOUNDED MEN, INCLUDING THREE WHO WERE SEVERELY INJURED, BEFORE BEING FATALLY WOUNDED HIMSELF. CHIEF ETCHBERGER'S COURAGE UNDER FIRE AND HIS DETERMINATION TO SAVE THE LIVES OF HIS FELLOW AIRMEN WERE EXTRAORDINARY.

HIS ACTIONS REMAINED CLASSIFIED FOR MANY YEARS DUE TO THE COVERT NATURE OF THE MISSION. IN 2010, PRESIDENT BARACK OBAMA POSTHUMOUSLY AWARDED CHIEF MASTER SERGEANT RICHARD L. ETCHBERGER THE MEDAL OF HONOR FOR HIS GALLANTRY AND VALOR, RECOGNIZING HIS BRAVERY AND SACRIFICE IN THE LINE OF DUTY.
