This mission directive implements Air Force Policy Directive (AFPD) 38-1, *Manpower and Organization*. This publication applies to Standoff Munitions Application Center (SMAC) and subordinate units as well as any Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) and Air National Guard (ANG) associated units. Its purpose is to define the mission, command structure, and responsibilities of SMAC. This publication may not be supplemented. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the office of primary responsibility using Department of the Air Force (DAF) Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route DAF 847 from field units through the appropriate functional chain of command. Ensure all records generated as a result of processes prescribed in this publication adhere to Air Force Instruction (AFI) 33-322, *Records Management and Information Governance Program*, and are disposed of in accordance with the Air Force Records Disposition Schedule, which is located in the Air Force Records Information Management System.

- 1. Mission.** Support the warfighter and enable full-spectrum dominance through integrated planning of lethal and non-lethal joint and multinational standoff fires.
- 2. Command.** SMAC is a Center assigned to the Joint Global Strike Operations Center (J-GSOC). Commander, SMAC commands the assigned and attached forces across the distributed SMAC enterprise.
- 3. Responsibilities.** The Commander, SMAC:

- 3.1. Is responsible to J-GSOC/CC for administration, training, and readiness of assigned forces.
- 3.2. Provides global, all-domain coordination of integrated long-range fires and detailed air-launched standoff weapons planning for United States Strategic Command (USSTRATCOM) under its UCP Global Strike Mission, the services and other Combatant Commands, as available.
 - 3.2.1. Provides integrated weapons plans and products to USSTRATCOM bomber units and supporting forces.
 - 3.2.2. Provides immediate and dedicated long-range fires planning and integration across the full range of military operations to supporting/supported Combatant Commanders and their components.
 - 3.2.3. Provides support to Air Force and other Service operational elements via access to weapon routing files and databases.
 - 3.2.4. Provides target suitability analysis; weapon-target pairing; weapon route planning and optimization; kinetic and non-kinetic effects packaging, integration and synchronization; strike planning materials production; weapon survivability analysis; high-fidelity modeling and simulation; dynamic targeting; inflight retargeting; and battle management.
- 3.3. Advances standoff weapons employment through innovation, advocacy and the development of operational concepts.
 - 3.3.1. Communicates with Air Force organizations at all levels, other Services, combat support agencies, Combatant Commands, Joint Staff, and the Intelligence Community on operational and strategic matters of direct interest to SMAC's mission areas and responsibilities.
 - 3.3.2. Provides subject matter expertise to Air Force and other Service acquisition, experimentation and development efforts.
 - 3.3.3. Provides subject matter expertise to Air Force doctrine, tactics, techniques and procedures development efforts.
 - 3.3.4. Supports readiness of Combat Air Force and other Service units.
- 3.4. Manages standoff weapon route production taskings for SMAC-associated Air National Guard and Air Force Reserve Command squadrons.
- 3.5. Maintains an appropriate staff to plan, program, budget, support, maintain, and execute resources and requirements within SMAC.

Air-Launched Standoff Weapon—Any conventional munition employed from an aircraft that is able to travel more than 100 nautical miles from launch point to target. The term includes hypersonic, network-enabled and inflight-retargetable weapons and cruise missiles.

Integration—The uniting of interrelated and interdependent effects in time, space and purpose.

Long-Range Fires—Operational fires into the Joint Force Commander’s deep area, both kinetic and non-kinetic, conducted from standoff ranges.
