***SUMMARY OF CHANGES***

**1. Mission:** The 655<sup>th</sup> Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance Wing provides a single command and control structure for geographically separated units and provides combat ready airmen in support of highly technical, diverse and complicated Intelligence, Surveillance and

Reconnaissance mission sets of AFRC Intelligence Squadrons such as human intelligence collection and reporting, geospatial and measurement, signals intelligence analysis and production capability, cyber intelligence surveillance, intelligence supportability, specialized analysis, and the execution of the crypto linguistic mission, targeting requirements determination, signals intelligence collection management, exploitation, analysis and internal/external mission support to worldwide globally-networked Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance operations.

**2. Command.** The 655<sup>th</sup> Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance Wing Commander: Reports to the Commander, Tenth Air Force.

2.1. Exercises administrative control over assigned personnel and assigned unit.

**3. Responsibilities.**

3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*.

3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance missions.
