This Mission Directive implements guidance in AFI 38-101, *Manpower and Organization*. It delineates the mission, command relationships, and responsibilities of Contingency Response Squadrons/Flights. This Mission Directive applies to individuals assigned to HQ AFRC. It does not apply to Regular Air Force, Space Force, or ANG units. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with IAW AFI 33-322, *Records Management and Information Governance Program*, and disposed of IAW the Air Force Records Information Management System and Records Disposition Schedule. Contact supporting records managers as required. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the OPR using DAF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route DAF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command. Submit requests for waivers through the chain of command to the publication OPR for non-tiered compliance items. This publication may not be supplemented or further implemented or extended.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This document has been substantially revised and needs to be completely reviewed. Major changes include update to the purpose, mission, and attachment and references.

1. Mission: The AFRC Contingency Response Squadrons/Flights are responsible for planning, coordinating, and participating in Major Command, service, joint and combined exercises, and execute contingency and humanitarian assistance/disaster relief operations. AFRC Contingency Response units are a rapid response organic capability that provides initial airbase opening capability and operations, bridge the gap between seizure forces and the follow-on combat or expeditionary combat support forces when required, extend the global mobility en-route system, jointly open ports, and operate worldwide where little or no air operations support exists. Mission areas include airfield operations, command/control/ communications, aerial port services, joint airload planning instruction, enroute maintenance, security, weather, and intelligence at airfields/landing zones.

2. Command. The Contingency Response Squadrons/Flights Commander:

2.1. Reports to the Commander of their assigned Operations Group when assigned to a Wing organization or will report to the Commander of a Contingency Response Group when assigned.

2.2. Exercises administrative control over assigned personnel.

3. Responsibilities.

3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*.

3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the Contingency Response Squadrons/Flights mission as defined in AFI 10-202, *Contingency Response Forces*.
