**SUMMARY OF CHANGES**

This publication has been revised to update the purpose, mission and the references section.

**1. Mission.** AFR Aerial Port Squadron provide trained, combat ready citizen airman personnel and equipment in direct support for the airlift movement of cargo, mail and passengers during worldwide humanitarian efforts, exercises, contingencies, and emergencies to support Rapid Global Mobility operations directed by the Department of Defense.

**2. Command.** The Aerial Port Squadron Commander:

2.1. Reports to their assigned AFRC Airlift Group, Mission Support Group or Regional Support Group Commander.

2.2. Exercises administrative control over assigned forces.

**3. Responsibilities.**

3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*.

3.2. Provides management and oversight for the execution of the aerial port mission.
