**Mission Directive**

**MEDICAL GROUPS**

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**COMPLIANCE WITH THIS PUBLICATION IS MANDATORY**

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This mission directive implements guidance in AFI 38-101, *Manpower and Organization*. It delineates the mission, command relationships, and responsibilities of AFRC Medical Groups. This mission directive applies to individuals assigned to HQ AFRC and subordinate units. It does not apply to Regular Air Force, Space Force, or Air National Guard units. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained IAW AFI 33-322, *Records Management and Information Governance Program*, and disposed of IAW the Air Force Records Information Management System Records Disposition Schedule. Contact supporting records managers as required. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility using DAF 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route DAF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command. This publication may not be supplemented or further implemented/extended.

***SUMMARY OF CHANGES***

This publication has been substantially revised and needs to be completely reviewed. Major changes include updates to the purpose and references.

**1. Mission.** Provides a management support structure at parent wing locations where multiple ground medical units are assigned. It serves as the wing commander's liaison for medical activities and provides the necessary coordination and supervision of diverse, highly specialized medical resources. The Medical Groups ensures citizen airmen are properly led, trained and equipped to

execute mission assigned and provides a singular authoritative source for the interpretation and direction of medical policy.

**2. Command** . The Medical Group Commander:

- 2.1. Reports to the Commander of the assigned wing.
- 2.2. Exercises administrative control over assigned personnel.

**3. Responsibilities.**

- 3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*.
- 3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the medical mission.
