**SUMMARY OF CHANGES**

This publication has been substantially revised and needs to be completely reviewed. Major changes include updates to the purpose, mission, and references.

**1. Mission.** The 26<sup>th</sup> Space Aggressor Squadron provides expert citizen airmen to prepare, educate and train joint forces and coalition partners for combat effectiveness to fight in and through contested, degraded, and operationally limited environments. The 26<sup>th</sup> Space Aggressor Squadron accomplishes this mission by knowing, analyzing, teaching, and replicating realistic, relevant, and

integrated space threats in the following areas: satellite communication and Global Positioning System electronic warfare, orbital warfare, and Space related cyber operations. The 26<sup>th</sup> Space Aggressor Squadron partners as a classic associate unit with the 527<sup>th</sup> Space Aggressor Squadron and 57<sup>th</sup> Space Aggressor Squadron performing these missions.

**2. Command.** The 26<sup>th</sup> Space Aggressor Squadron Commander:

- 2.1. Reports to the 926th Group Commander.
- 2.2. Exercises administrative control over assigned personnel.

**3. Responsibilities.**

3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*.

- 3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the 26<sup>th</sup> Space Aggressor Squadron mission.
