This Mission Directive implements policy and guidance in AFD 38-1, *Manpower and Organization*, AFI 38-101, *Manpower and Organization*. It delineates the mission, command relationships, and responsibilities of AFRC Aircraft Maintenance Squadrons (AMXS). This Mission Directive applies to individuals assigned to HQ AFRC. It does not apply to Regular Air Force, Space Force, or ANG units. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with IAW AFI 33-322, *Records Management and Information Governance Program*, and disposed of IAW the Air Force Records Information Management System and Records Disposition Schedule. Contact supporting records managers as required. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the OPR using DAF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route DAF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command. This publication may not be supplemented

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This publication has been substantially revised and needs to be completely reviewed. Major changes include updates to the purpose, responsibilities, and references.

1. Mission. The AMXS provides overall management and supervision of daily maintenance activities; tracks discrepancies, deviations, utilization and applicable flight data for each aircraft at the termination of sorties; provides support to flightline maintenance and generation activities; and

ensures all mobility requirements are met. The AMXS also services, inspects, maintains, launches, and recovers assigned/transient aircraft (if applicable).

1.1. In AFRC non-standard/associated units, AMXS elements may be included in the Maintenance Squadron. Refer to AFRCMD11-008, *Maintenance Squadrons*, for mission responsibilities for elements when assigned within the Maintenance Squadron.

2. Command. The Commander of the AMXS:

2.1. Reports to their assigned Maintenance Group Commander, or equivalent.

2.2. Exercises administrative control over assigned AMXS personnel.

3. Responsibilities.

3.1. Execute Commanders responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*, DAFI 36-2670, *Total Force Development*, and Maintenance Group Commander responsibilities as outlined in DAFI 21-101, *Aircraft and Equipment Maintenance Management*.

3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the AMXS mission.
