This Mission Directive applies to individuals assigned to HQ AFRC and subordinate units. This publication does not apply to Regular Air Force, Air National Guard, or US Space Force. SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This publication has been substantially revised and needs to be completely reviewed. The purpose, mission, and attachment has been substantially updated.

1. Mission. The primary mission of the Logistics Readiness Squadrons/Flights is to provide trained Citizen Airmen to defend the United States, and logistics command and control for the wing's mission and to support Air Expeditionary Task Force and contingency operations. The

Logistics Readiness Squadrons/Flights will provide materiel and traffic management to include receiving, shipping, issuing, storage and control of property and equipment; provide bulk storage and management of petroleum and cryogenic products; provide efficient ground transportation and vehicle management services as well as installation planning and execution of unit movement, reception, beddown and redeployment operations.

2. Command. The Logistics Readiness Squadrons/Flights Commander:

- 2.1. Reports to the Commander of their assigned Mission Support Group.
- 2.2. Exercises administrative control over assigned personnel.

3. Responsibilities.

- 3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*.
- 3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the Logistics Readiness Squadrons/Flights mission.
