This mission directive implements guidance in AFI 38-101, *Manpower and Organization*. It delineates the mission, command relationships, and responsibilities of AFRC Global Power Fighter Squadrons. This mission directive applies to individuals assigned to HQ AFRC and subordinate units. It does not apply to Regular Air Force, Space Force, or Air National Guard units. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained IAW AFI 33-322, *Records Management and Information Governance Program*, and disposed of IAW the Air Force Records Information Management System Records Disposition Schedule. Contact supporting records managers as required. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the OPR using DAF 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route DAF 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command. This publication may not be supplemented at any level.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This publication has been revised to clarify the title, purpose, mission, command, update the glossary/references and added an [Attachment 2](#).

1. Mission. Air Force Reserve Command's, Global Power, Fighter and Attack Wings, assigned to 10AF, provide ready and trained citizen airmen in three of the five Air Force Core Mission Areas: air & space superiority; intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance; and global strike.

Capable of generating airpower for Counterair, Counter-land, and Counter-sea operations in order to meet joint force commander objectives, the Wing Commanders provide oversight and readiness advocacy to HQ AFRC and 10 AF staff directorates to present deployable aviation/ support equipment and associated forces to support unified combatant commands.

2. Command. The identified AFRC Fighter and Attack Wings are direct reporting units assigned to 10 AF (see [Attachment 2 Figure A2.1](#)).

2.1. Reports through their assigned chain of command to the Tenth Air Force CC.

2.2. Wing Commanders exercises administrative control over assigned personnel in accordance with DAFI 51-201, *Administration of Military Justice*.

3. Responsibilities.

3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*.

3.2. Provides mission-ready, expeditionary airmen to support unified combatant commanders for on-going military operations.

3.3. Provides deployable and expeditionary aviation and support teams to execute global power operations and support worldwide.

3.4. Extends the existing Combat Air Forces' infrastructure through agile combat employment and delivery of rapid forward deployable capabilities and presentation of forces to warfighting unified commanders.

3.5. Advocates with the commander of Air Force forces, HQ AFRC, and 10 AF-Staff Directors for installation readiness and preparedness of force to support operational requirements.

3.6. Exercises Senior Rater responsibilities for the deliberate development of Airmen for today and tomorrow's operations.
