This Mission Directive applies to individuals assigned to HQ AFRC. It does not apply to Regular Air Force, Space Force, or Air National Guard units. Contact supporting records managers as required. SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This publication has been revised to update the purpose and references section.

1. Mission. The Aeromedical Evacuation Squadrons provides operational support in aeromedical evacuation operations to support the full spectrum of potential scenarios, including but not limited to, humanitarian assistance and disaster relief operations, small-scale contingencies, major theater war, and defense support of civilian authorities. The Aeromedical Evacuation Squadrons ensures

mission capability and force presentation to supported commands and combatant commanders, ensuring global patient movement capability in support of national military objectives.

2. Command. The Aeromedical Evacuation Squadrons Commander:

- 2.1. Reports to their assigned AFRC Operations Group.
- 2.2. Exercises administrative control over assigned forces.

3. Responsibilities.

- 3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*.
- 3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the Aeromedical Evacuation mission.
