This Mission Directive implements guidance in AFI 38-101, *Manpower and Organization*. It delineates the mission, command relationships, and responsibilities of Red Horse Squadrons. This Mission Directive applies to individuals assigned to HQ AFRC. It does not apply to Regular Air Force, Space Force, or ANG units. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with IAW AFI 33-322, *Records Management and Information Governance Program*, and disposed of IAW the Air Force Records Information Management System and Records Disposition Schedule. SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This publication has been revised to update the purpose, mission, and references section.

1. Mission. RED HORSE is a self-sufficient, mobile, heavy construction squadron capable of rapid response and independent operations in remote, high-threat environments worldwide. They provide heavy repair and construction capabilities when requirements exceed that of Prime Base Engineer Emergency Force (Prime BEEF) civil engineer unit capabilities. The primary mission of RED HORSE Squadrons is to assess, plan and establish contingency facilities/infrastructure to support humanitarian/contingency operations and combat missions. Activities include rapid assessment/repair, bare-base development, and heavy construction operations such as runways, aircraft parking ramps, and large facilities. RED HORSE Squadrons possesses special capabilities such as remote beddown planning, explosive demolition, quarry operations, material testing, concrete and asphalt paving, and expedient facility construction.

2. Command. The RED HORSE Squadron Commander:

- 2.1. Reports to the Commander, 622d Civil Engineer Group.
- 2.2. Exercises administrative control over assigned personnel and assigned units.

3. Responsibilities.

- 3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*.
- 3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the RED HORSE mission.
