This Mission Directive implements guidance in AFI 38-101, *Manpower and Organization*. It delineates the mission, command relationships, and responsibilities of Tactical Airlift Squadrons. This Mission Directive applies to individuals assigned to HQ AFRC. It does not apply to Regular Air Force, Space Force, or ANG units. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with IAW AFI 33-322, *Records Management and Information Governance Program*, and disposed of IAW the Air Force Records Information Management System and Records Disposition Schedule. Contact supporting records managers as required. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the OPR using DAF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route DAF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command. SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This document has been substantially revised and needs to be completely reviewed. Major changes include update to the purpose, mission, and attachment and references.

1. Mission Provide intra-theater airlift capabilities to meet Combatant Commander requirements. Provide capabilities to support airlift, airdrop and air land of personnel, equipment, and supplies.

1.1. In addition to meeting Combatant Commander requirements:

1.1.1. The 731st Airlift Squadron equipped with the Modular Airborne Fire Fighting System provides trained aircrew and support personnel to meet all MAFF requirements determined by US Forest Service for joint firefighting support missions.

1.1.2. The 757th Airlift Squadron equipped with the Modular Aerial Spray System provides trained aircrew and support personnel to meet Vis Aerial Spray requirements set forth by the Combatant Commander.

2. Command. The Tactical Airlift Squadron Commander:

2.1. Reports to their assigned Operations/Airlift Group.

2.2. Exercises administrative control over assigned personnel.

3. Responsibilities.

3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*.

3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the Tactical Airlift mission.
