This Mission Directive implements policy and guidance in Air Force Instruction (AFI) 38-101, *Manpower and Organization*. It delineates the mission, command relationships, and responsibilities of Combat Operations Squadrons (COS). This Mission Directive applies to individuals assigned to 610th Air Operations Group (AOG), DET 1 926th Operations Group (OG), 713th Combat Operations Squadron, 701st Combat Operations Squadron, and 710th Combat Operations Squadron. It does not apply to 854 Combat Operations Squadrons (COS), Regular Air Force (RegAF), Space Force (SF), or Air National Guard (ANG) units. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with (IAW) AFI 33-322, *Records Management and Information Governance Program*, and disposed of IAW the Air Force Records Information Management System and Records Disposition Schedule. Contact supporting records managers as required. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility (OPR) using Department of Air Force (DAF) Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route DAF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command. Submit requests for waivers through the chain of command to the publication OPR for non-tiered compliance items. This publication may not be supplemented or further implemented or extended.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This document has been substantially revised and needs to be completely reviewed. Major changes include update to the purpose, mission, and attachment and references.

1. Mission: Provides well-trained, experienced, mission-ready Citizen Airmen to integrate into active components AOCs. Delivers precise, reliable, and full-spectrum joint airpower command, control, and communications capabilities, including strategy development, detailed planning, target development, weaponeering, Air Tasking Order (ATO) production, operational-level execution and assessment to the joint force through proficient use of the weapons system applications and hardware to execute operations anytime, anywhere in support of National Security Objectives and to meet Combatant Command (CCMD) requirements.

2. Command. The Combat Operations Squadrons Commander.

2.1. Reports to the Commander, 610th Air Operations Group.

2.2. Exercises administrative control over assigned personnel.

3. Responsibilities.

3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*.

3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the Combat Operations Squadrons mission.
