This Mission Directive implements guidance in Air Force Instruction (AFI) 38-101, *Manpower and Organization*. It delineates the mission, command relationships, and responsibilities of 960th Cyberspace Wing. This Mission Directive applies to individuals assigned to Headquarters, Air Force Reserve Command (HQ AFRC). It does not apply to Regular Air Force (RegAF), Space Force (SF), or Air National Guard (ANG) units. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with (IAW) AFI 33-322, *Records Management and Information Governance Program*, and disposed of IAW the Air Force Records Information Management System and Records Disposition Schedule. Contact supporting records managers as required. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility (OPR) using Department of Air Force (DAF) Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route DAF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command. Submit requests for waivers through the chain of command to the publication OPR for non-tiered compliance items. This publication may not be supplemented or further implemented or extended.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This document has been substantially revised and needs to be completely reviewed. Major changes include update to the purpose, mission, and attachment and references.

1. Mission: The 960th Cyberspace Wing provides a single command and control structure of geographically separated Network Warfare, Combat Communications, and Network, Information

and Combat Operations units. The 960th Cyberspace Wing provides combat ready forces with specialized expertise, continuity and resiliency in the operation, defense and extension of Air Force and Department of Defense Global Information Grids in support of access to the global commons through Cyberspace for National Interests.

2. Command. The 960th Cyberspace Wing Commander:

- 2.1. Reports to and operates under the policy and guidance of 10th Air Force.
- 2.2. Exercises administrative control over assigned personnel at the 860th Cyberspace Operations Group, Robins AFB, GA and the 960th Cyberspace Operations Group, Joint Base San Antonio-Lackland, TX and all subordinate units.
- 2.3. Ensures subordinate units operate and train to operate cyber weapon systems in accordance with 16th Air Force guidance and operational standards.

3. Responsibilities.

- 3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*.
- 3.2. Provide oversight and execution of the cyberspace mission supporting joint and combatant commander objectives.
- 3.3. Provide guidance, direction, and oversight of all AFRC cyber activities, including integration of combat comm and innovative employment methods across the wing's breadth of scope.
- 3.4. Provide combat ready, trained personnel to execute defensive cyberspace missions on AF and Department of Defense networks and systems in defense of core AF functions and to ensure critical Department of Defense missions.
- 3.5. Provide trained operators to execute vulnerability assessments on AF and Department of Defense networks and systems in order to ensure appropriate integrity, security and network defense posture is enforced.
- 3.6. Maintain a rapidly deployable (within 72 hours) combat communication capability to meet AF and combatant commander contingency requirements.
- 3.7. Ensure Reserve participation in cyberspace governance forums from USCYBERCOM, MAJCOMs, 10 AF, 16 AF, and other applicable total force integration cyber mission partners in an effort to reduce costs, complexity, and unnecessary duplication of effort.
- 3.8. Work with HQ AFRC, HQ Air Combat Command, and Numbered Air Force staffs to enhance AF total force integration and cyber programs and relationships. MAJCOM and Numbered Air Force staffs are authorized Direct Liaison Authority to coordinate total force integration and/or cyber education development, support, tactics, concept development, analysis and assessment with appropriate elements of 688th Cyberspace Wing and 67th Cyberspace Wing.

3.9. Identify and advocate for rapid innovation initiatives, both leveraging cyberspace capabilities and operating through cyberspace, utilizing commercial and civilian sector skillsets that Reserve members bring from external sources.
