This Mission Directive applies to individuals assigned to HQ AFRC. It does not apply to Regular Air Force, Space Force, or ANG units. **SUMMARY OF CHANGES**

This document has been substantially revised and needs to be completely reviewed. Major changes include update to the purpose, mission, and attachment and references.

**1. Mission:** Monitor Air Force communications and computer systems in order to determine operational security postures, network security, or if any information is being revealed that may be of intelligence value to an adversary. Develop and forward cyberspace operations risk

assessments to applicable customers. Assist in integrating information operations with cyberspace operations in order to shape Air Force security and when necessary, the battle space.

**2. Command.** The Network Warfare Squadron Commander:

- 2.1. Reports to the 960th Cyberspace Operations Group Commander.
- 2.2. Exercises administrative control over assigned personnel.

**3. Responsibilities.**

- 3.1. Execute commander's responsibilities as outlined in AFI 1-2, *Commander's Responsibilities*.
- 3.2. Provides oversight and execution of the network warfare mission.
