This mission directive implements guidance in Air Force Instruction (AFI) 38-101, *Manpower and Organization*. This Air Mobility Command (AMC) Mission Directive prescribes the mission, command relationship, responsibilities, and organization of the United States Air Force Expeditionary Center (USAFEC). It applies to Air Mobility Command, USAFEC and United States Space Force (USSF) units and members. This publication applies to the Air National Guard upon mobilization. This publication does not apply to Air Force Reserve Command Units. Ensure all records generated as a result of processes prescribed in this publication adhere to AFI 33-322, *Records Management and Information Governance Program*, and are disposed in accordance with (IAW) the Air Force Records Disposition Schedule, which is located in the Air Force Records Information Management System. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility (OPR) using the DAF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route DAF Form 847 from the field through the appropriate functional's chain of command. Submit requests for waivers through the chain of command to the publication OPR for non-tiered compliance items. This publication may not be supplemented or further implemented or extended.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This document revision updated terms and references, mission descriptions, and authorities, as well as adding the new exercise program.

1. Mission. The USAFEC mission is to train, educate, exercise, and enable combat support and mobility Airmen to conduct global enroute and contingency response operations, air advising, joint base management, and installation support. The USAFEC is the Air Force's center of excellence for expeditionary combat support and advanced training and education for Mobility Air Forces and other major commands as directed by Headquarters Air Force. The USAFEC provides command oversight to five AMC wings, two AMC groups, and one school. Located on Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, New Jersey, the USAFEC partners with the Air Staff, AMC, Air Education and Training Command, and the United States Air Force Warfare Center to provide a disciplined training process assuring the right skills are taught at the right time across the expeditionary enterprise.

2. Command. USAFEC is a direct reporting unit assigned to AMC (see [Figure A2.1](#) for organizational structure).

2.1. USAFEC/CC is under the command of AMC/CC, and normal command channels apply except when otherwise authorized. USAFEC/CC exercises administrative control (ADCON) of assigned forces to include directive authority to organize, train, and equip.

2.2. USAFEC/CC exercises General Court-Martial Convening Authority (GCMCA) over assigned and attached personnel in accordance with Department of Air Force Instruction (DAFI) 51-201, *Administration of Military Justice*.

3. Responsibilities.

3.1. Commands five wings, two groups, and one school focusing on the evolving mobility and expeditionary combat support missions to include: contingency response, air advising, global enroute operations, joint basing and installation support, advanced ready training, Security Forces' Raven training, advanced mobility training, command and control training and education, Contingency Response Force training, and exercises.

3.2. Provides Joint Base command oversight for AMC-led Joint Bases McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst and Charleston. Further, is the Senior Air Force commander providing command oversight on the Army-chaired Joint Base Lewis-McChord Intermediate Command Summit.

3.3. Provides installation management to Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, Space Force, and Coast Guard mission partners on the command's joint bases.

3.4. Provides leadership, oversight, and administrative support for the Advanced Study of Air Mobility, an Intermediate Developmental Education program through the Air Force Institute of Technology that is housed within the USAFEC Headquarters.

3.5. Advocates with AMC Commander, Air Force Forces and Staff Directors for installation readiness and preparedness of force to support operational requirements.

3.6. Presents trained, equipped, and ready forces for worldwide deployments or tasking requirements.

3.7. Presents rapidly deployable equipment and multi-skilled, expeditionary combat forces as sourced by lead command processes to quickly open forward contingency airbases and extend air mobility support worldwide. Provides expertise and mobile equipment to execute initial airfield operations and expedite the delivery of joint/combined follow-on forces.

3.8. Provides administrative support of joint integration exercise program STORM FLAG.

3.9. Rapidly expands the existing Global Air Mobility Support System by in-place employment, rapid forward deployment capabilities in the form of Air Mobility Teams, and presentation of Contingency Response Forces to warfighting unified commanders.

3.10. Serves as the 2-star lead for USAF Security Force Assistance/Air Advising (SFA/AA) responsible for developing implementation strategies and procedures tailored to increase effective planning, programming, and execution of SFA and operational advising activities.
