MUNITIONS MANAGEMENT

COMPLIANCE WITH THIS PUBLICATION IS MANDATORY

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This supplement implements and extends the guidance of AFMAN 21-201, *Munitions Management*, 26 March 2019. This supplement outlines procedures for all munitions accounts on base, as well as contingencies and wartime taskings. These procedures apply to anyone engaged in any form of munitions activity and assigned to the 27th Special Operations Wing. All users should be familiar with AFMAN 21-201, *Munitions Management*, AFMAN 91-201, *Explosive Safety Standards*, all applicable supplements, and any other publications pertaining to munitions management and explosive safety. Ensure that all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this publication are maintained in accordance with (IAW) Air Force Manual (AFMAN) 33-363, *Management of Records*, and disposed of IAW Air Force Records Disposition Schedule (RDS) located in the Air Force Records Information Management System (AFRIMS). Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary responsibility (OPR) using the AF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publications*; route AF Form 847s through appropriate functional chain of command.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES

This document has been substantially revised and requires a complete review in its entirety. It has been rewritten to align with the change from an Air Force Instruction (AFI) to an Air Force Manual (AFMAN).

3.13.3.5.1. **(Added)** 27 SOMXS/Munitions Flight will be the focal point for the management of Material Potentially Presenting an Explosive Hazard (MPPEH) as explosive until certified to be

free of explosives material IAW DoD Instruction (DoDI) 4140.62, *Material Potentially Presenting an Explosive Hazard*. Disposal of MPPEH by agencies or personnel not identified in Technical Order 11A-1-60, *General Instruction - Inspection of Reusable Munitions Containers and Scrap Material Generated from Items Exposed to, or Containing Explosives*, will coordinate inspection and turn in with the Munitions Flight.

3.13.3.5.2. **(Added)** All MPPEH will be treated as containing the original Net Explosive Weight and hazards until inspected by the competent authority.

3.13.4.2.1.1. **(Added)** Operational units organically transporting munitions off-station or transporting via line-haul, WILL maintain chain of custody unless proper disposal and reconciliation of munitions residue is coordinated by the Munitions Flight with the host installation prior to departure. This includes taking aircraft ammunition (105mm, 30mm, etc.) TDY. When accountability of the TDY ammunition will be tracked on the home-station DoDAAC, operational units are responsible for returning all expended cartridges to home-station to be inspected by the competent authority.

3.13.4.2.2.1. **(Added)** Range personnel will coordinate/schedule turn in of MPPEH at least quarterly.

4.3.5. **(Added)** All non-expendable safing gear and/or devices such as remove before flight tags or umbilical caps will be annotated on the AF Form 2434, *Munitions Configuration and Expenditure Document*.

4.3.5.1. **(Added)** All non-expendable safing gear and/or devices delivered to the using organization and/or annotated on the AF Form 2434 will be returned to the Munitions Flight for reconciliation, reuse and proper disposal. An MXG Form 11, *Lost Tool/Item Reporting Procedures*, (<https://cs2.eis.af.mil/sites/13211/Short/URL.html?q=bp08x>) will be generated by the organization in possession of lost safing gear and/or devices for submission as auditable documents to reconcile munitions expenditures.

7.4.7.4.1. **(Added)** TCI extension requests may be sent to Cannon.FV4855@us.af.mil.

7.6.4. **(Added)** The requesting organization is responsible for accomplishing the applicable AMC Form 1033, *Shipper's Declaration for Hazardous Goods*, and other documentation required for shipment.

7.8.1.4.1.1. **(Added)** Units will ensure they have all required equipment to transport munitions IAW AFMAN 91-201 and their custody storage agreement (i.e. vehicle placards, two 2A10BC fire extinguishers, vehicle chocks, etc.) prior to receipt.

7.8.2.4. **(Added)** Custodians will notify the MASO or Munitions Operations of a new AF Form 68 signatory within 20 days of assumption of command.
