**ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE PROGRAM**

**COMPLIANCE WITH THIS PUBLICATION IS MANDATORY**

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This supplement extends and implements Department of the Air Force Instruction (DAFI) 34-107, *Alcoholic Beverage Program*. It establishes policies and procedures for the purchase and consumption of alcoholic beverages at Luke Air Force Base (AFB). It applies to 56th Fighter Wing (FW) and also applies to the U. S. Air Force Reserve (AFRC) and to Air National Guard (ANG) units and members attached or assigned to Luke AFB. Failure to observe the prohibitions and mandatory provision in DAFI 34-107 paragraphs 3.1.6. and 3.1.8. by military members is a violation of Article 92 of the UCMJ,” or similar language. Refer recommended changes and questions about this publication to the Office of Primary Responsibility (OPR) using the DAF Form 847, *Recommendation for Change of Publication*; route DAF Forms 847 from the field through the appropriate functional chain of command. Ensure all records generated as a result of processes prescribed in this publication adhere to Air Force Instruction (AFI) 33-322, *Records Management and Information Governance Program*, and are disposed in accordance with the Air Force Records Disposition Schedule, which is located in the Air Force Records Information Management System. The authorities to waive wing, unit, delta or garrison level requirements in this publication are identified with a Tier (“T-0, T-1, T-2, T-3”) number following the compliance statement. Submit requests for waivers through the chain of command to the appropriate tier waiver approval authority or alternately to the publication OPR for non-tired compliance items. See DAF Manual (DAFMAN) 90-161, *Publishing Processes and Procedures*, for a description of the authorities associated with the tier numbers. 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### ***SUMMARY OF CHANGES***

**This document has been changed and should be reviewed.** This publication now implements DAFI34-107 and has been renumbered to correspond to the DAFI 34-107. The other changes are administrative only, updating certifying and approving authorities signature blocks.

3.1.5.1. **(Added)** The minimum drinking age for purchasing, possessing, or drinking alcoholic beverages on Luke Air Force Base (AFB) is 21 years of age. The sale, dispensing, possession, or consumption of alcoholic or malt beverages on base, except as provided by DAFI 34-107 and this supplement, are expressly prohibited. The minimum age for serving or selling of alcoholic beverages on Luke AFB is 19 years of age. Military members who are 21 years of age or older may purchase beer and light wine at the base package store or bulk beer for take-out at the Club Five Six Harlow's Lounge or Zemke's Den, Falcon Dunes Golf Course, Fort Tuthill, Base Exchange, and Lodging.

3.3.3. **(Added)** Any individual who sells, handles, or serves alcoholic beverages on Luke AFB will be required to receive Dram Shop training which will include, but is not limited to, reading applicable OIs and approved training material prior to commencing work. For non-appropriated fund (NAF) personnel, training will be documented on the AF Form 971, *Supervisor's Employee Brief*, and at a minimum refresher training will be conducted semiannually. Dram Shop training for military personnel or appropriated fund (APF) employees will be documented through training and education measurement systems or other organizational authorized methods.

3.6.5. **(Added)** Force Support Community Services and Sustainment Services Flight activities, i.e., Club Five Six, Fort Tuthill, and Falcon Dunes Golf Course, will develop an operating instruction (OI), which will be reviewed and approved by the 56th Force Support Squadron Commander (56 FSS/CC). The Lodging manager will develop an Operating Instruction (OI) for lodging personnel which will also be approved by the 56 FSS/CC. Each Force Support activity that serves and/or sells alcoholic beverages will write and establish an OI that designates Dram Shop responsibilities for the activity. All Force Support OIs will be reviewed and approved by the 56 FSS/CC.

4.1.8. **(Added)** The 56th Fighter Wing Commander (56 FW/CC) authorizes the following activities on Luke AFB in **Table 4.1** to sell alcoholic beverages, beer, or light wine during established operating hours:

**Table 4.1. (Added) Luke AFB Facilities Activities.**

1. Club Five Six
2. Base Exchange Package Store/Sales Outlets
3. Falcon Dunes Golf Course, Pro Shop, and Snack Bar
4. Community Commons
5. Fort Tuthill Recreation Area
6. Lodging: Distilled spirit miniatures or, if not available, 200 milliliter sizes; wine coolers and other premixed, commercially packaged alcoholic beverages with less than 7 percent

alcoholic content by volume (not to exceed 375 milliliters), wine (not to exceed one-liter containers), and beer (by the bottle or can).
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7. Army & Air Force Exchange Service (AAFES) activities
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4.2.1. **(Added)** Consumption and possession of open containers of alcoholic beverages are prohibited on Luke AFB except in the following locations approved by the 56 FW/CC (See [Table 4.2.](#)).

**Table 4.2. (Added) Luke AFB Exemption Locations.**

1. Club Five Six Lounges, Barcelona Room, ballroom, and patios of building 161
2. Falcon Dunes Golf Course Club House/Course, and Snack Bar
3. Outdoor Recreation swimming pool (Only during supervised pool parties. No swimming is permitted by those who consume alcoholic beverages. The requestor is responsible for the party and must complete Dram Shop training prior to the event.) Restricted to beer and light wine only (no glass).
4. Family Housing (except playgrounds and ball fields)
5. Lodging
6. Enlisted Dormitories
7. Picnic areas--beer and light wine only
8. Fowler Park
9. Community Commons
10. Ball fields (except during Youth Activities)-beer and light wine only
11. Riding Stables--beer and light wine only (located off Luke AFB run by a private organization).
12. Fort Tuthill Recreation Area
13. AAFES Food Court
14. Luke AFB Unit Heritage Rooms

4.2.2. **(Added)** Consumption and possession of alcoholic beverages in areas not approved in [Table 4.2](#) is prohibited, unless approved in writing, in advance, by the 56 FW/CC.

4.2.2.1. **(Added)** The commander of a group, squadron, or unit desiring to consume alcoholic beverages for an event in an area on the installation outside of [Table 4.2](#), unit heritage room, and/or Force Support Facility will request such authorization in writing through 56 FSS/CC to 56 FW/CC, IN TURN, at least 15 days before the function. Alcoholic beverages must be purchased from a base facility, i.e., Club Five Six or AAFES.

4.2.2.2. **(Added)** The requesting commander will comply with DAFI 34-107 and this supplement's requirements and will include the person or group sponsoring the event, purpose of the event, date, time, location, type(s) of alcoholic beverage(s) to be served (only beer and light wine), and name and rank of the project officer. The requesting commander certifies they will ensure alcoholic beverages are not consumed by anyone under the age of 21; that food and nonalcoholic beverages are available; and, that a safe transportation plan, approved by the requesting commander, is in place ([Attachment 2](#)).

4.3.1.6. **(Added)** Group and other equivalent unit commanders will establish guidelines for consumption of alcoholic beverages within their subordinate units' facilities which comply with DAFI 34-107 and this supplement, the Dram Shop theory of liability, and local, State and Federal laws. Excessive drinking and drinking contests are prohibited.

5.6.1. **(Added)** Club Five Six on Luke AFB may sell beer, wine, and other commercially packaged alcoholic beverages with less than 7 percent alcohol content by volume for off-premises consumption when AAFES operated outlets are closed. Fort Tuthill resale outlet may sell beer, wine, and miniature distilled spirits. Prices will be no less than AAFES prices for the same item. Packaged sales of beer and wine products incidental to party contracts or take-out food and beverage operations are exempt from this restriction.

5.9. **(Added)** In no instances shall any individual or organization engage in the sale of alcoholic beverages unless sold by an authorized Luke AFB Facility Activity (**Table 4.1**) in a 56 FW/CC approved area and done IAW DAFI 34-107 requirements.

I also understand we cannot engage in the sale of any alcoholic beverages, and it can only be sold by a Luke Force Support Activity.
